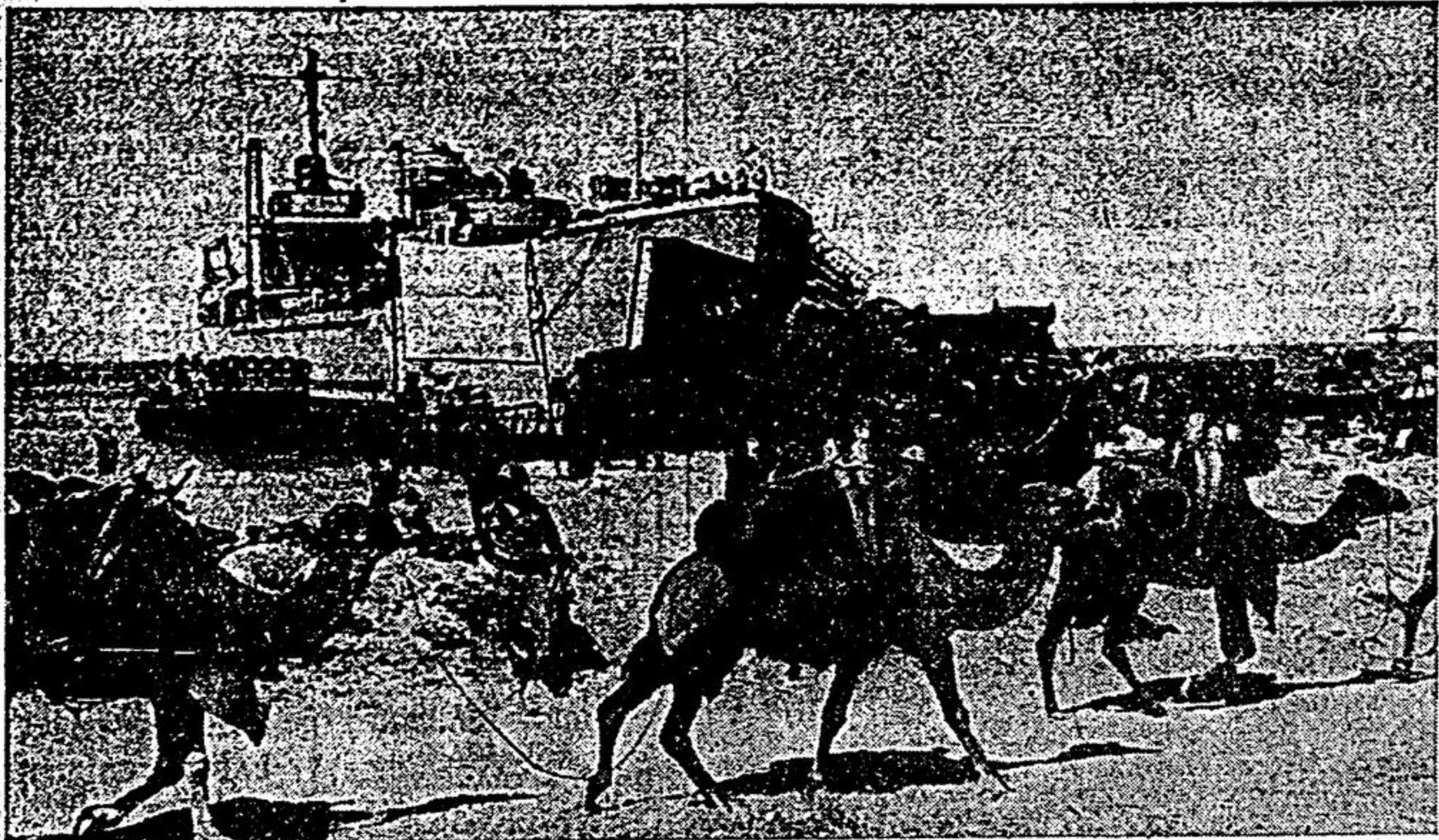


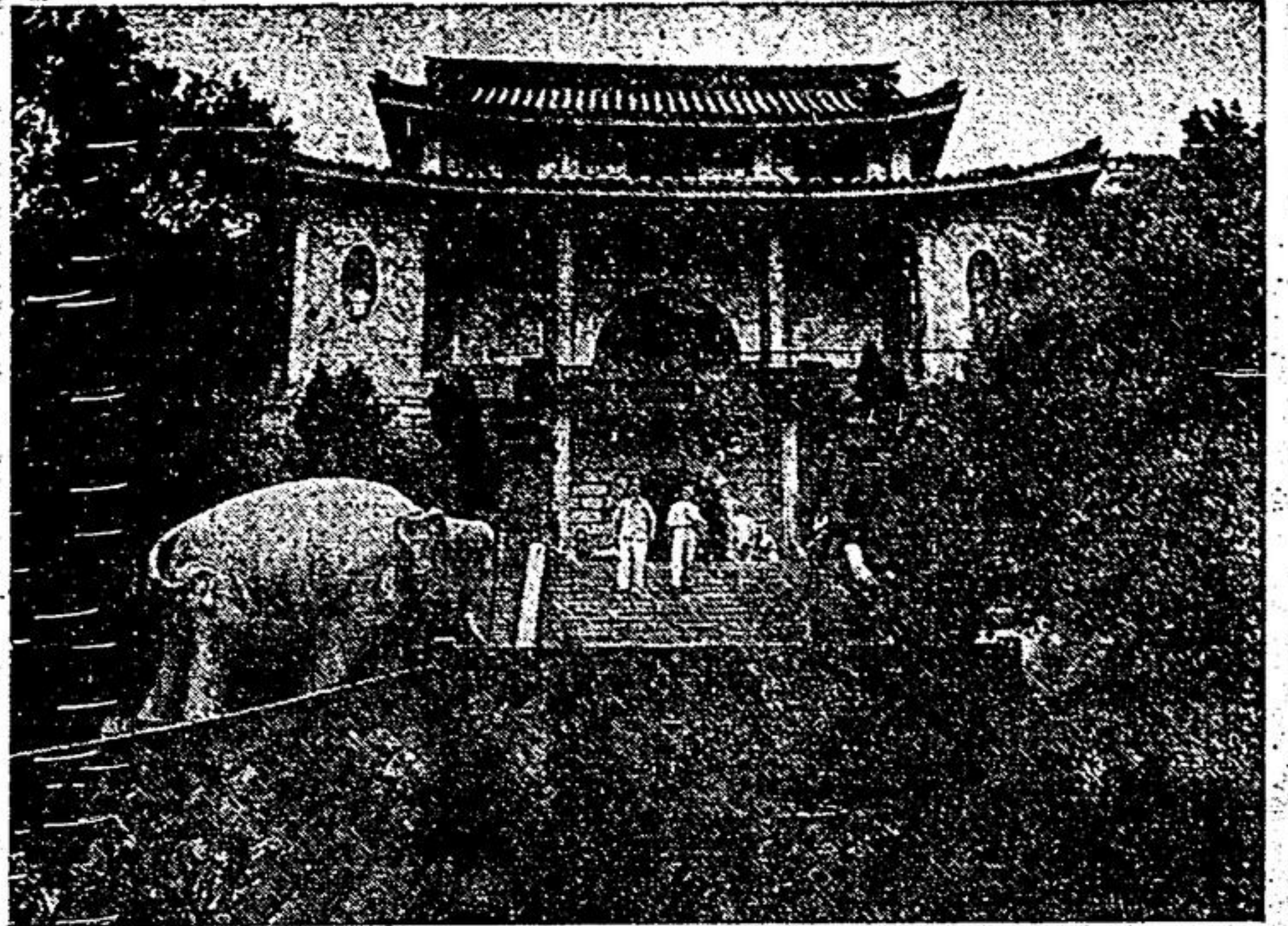

'Animals' Guard Taipei Temple

HIGH in the hills of suburban Taipei, capital of Formosa, lies one of the most colorful shrines in the Far East. The Yuan Tung temple is a Buddhist shrine operated by nuns who, in Buddhism, are given equality with the monks in matters of worship. One of the outstanding features of the temple are the huge animal sculptures guarding its approaches. A ferocious-looking lion scares away Oriental devils and a massive elephant correlates the Buddhism of India with that of Formosa. The artisan who designed the lion never saw such an animal since lions existed only by hearsay in the China of old. Each statue is regarded as a spiritual guardian and is the donation of devout families to the shrine of Yuan Tung. Donations also come from income that is derived from the farms.



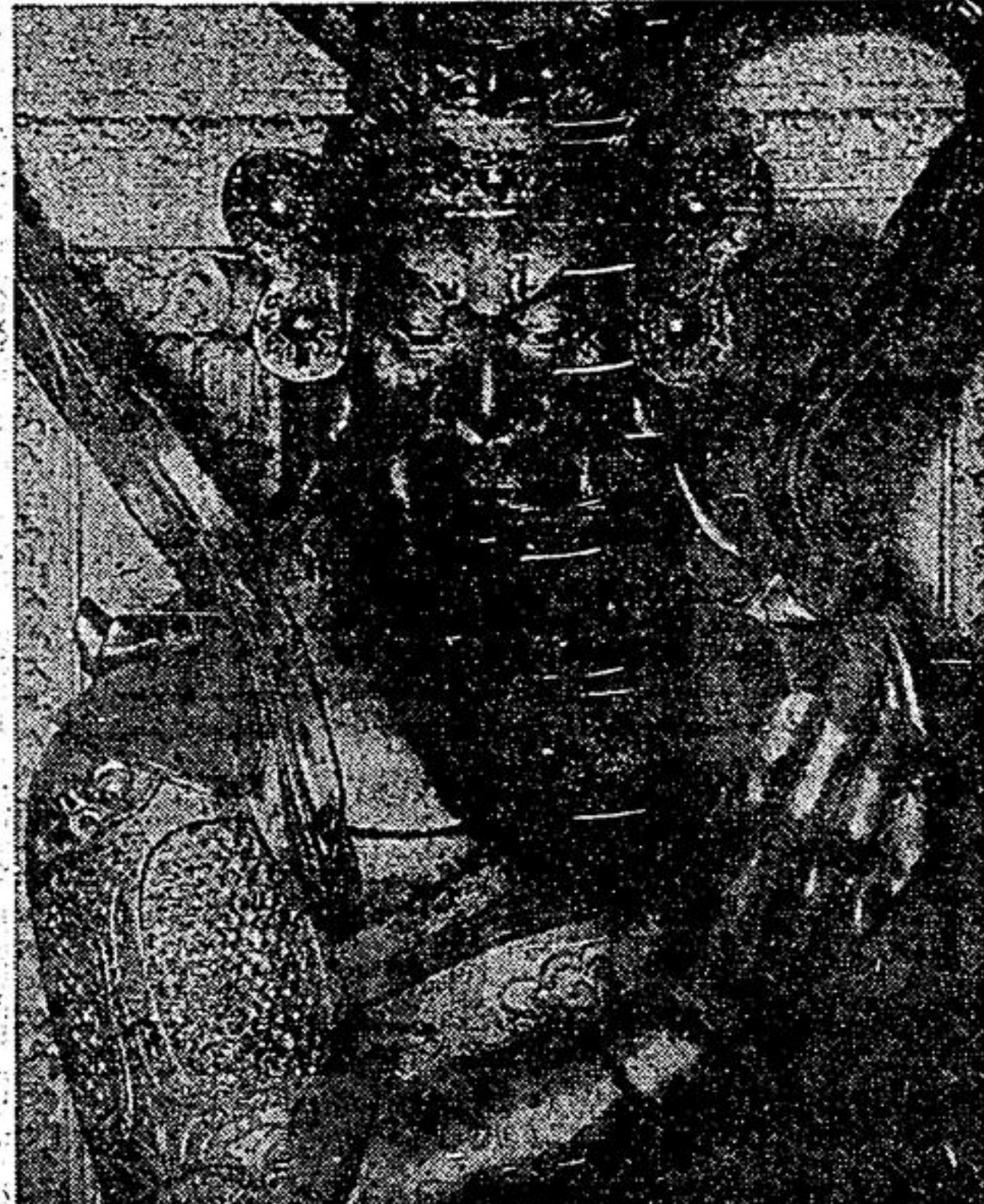
A massive stone elephant stands near the entrance of Yuan Tung shrine.

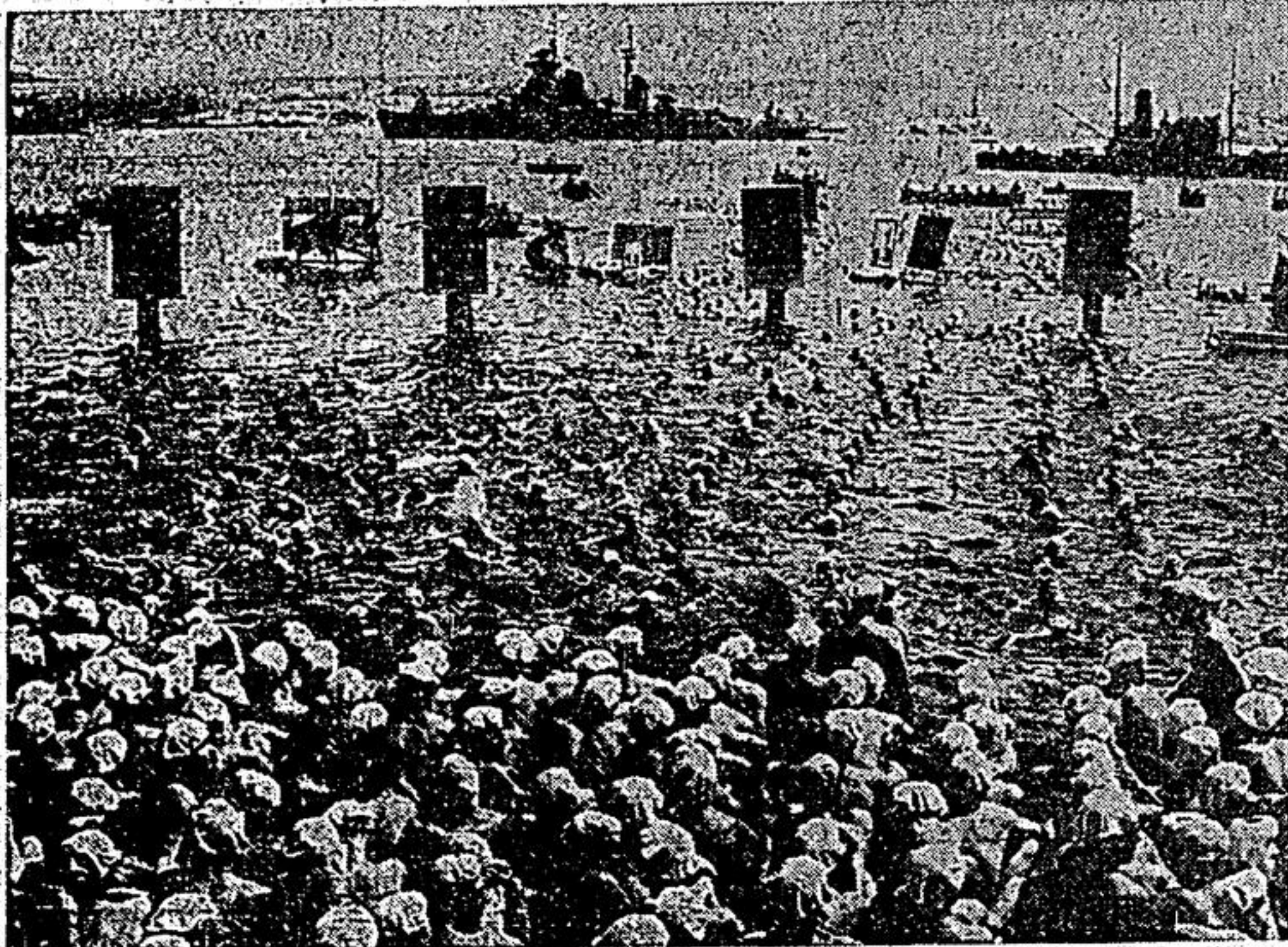

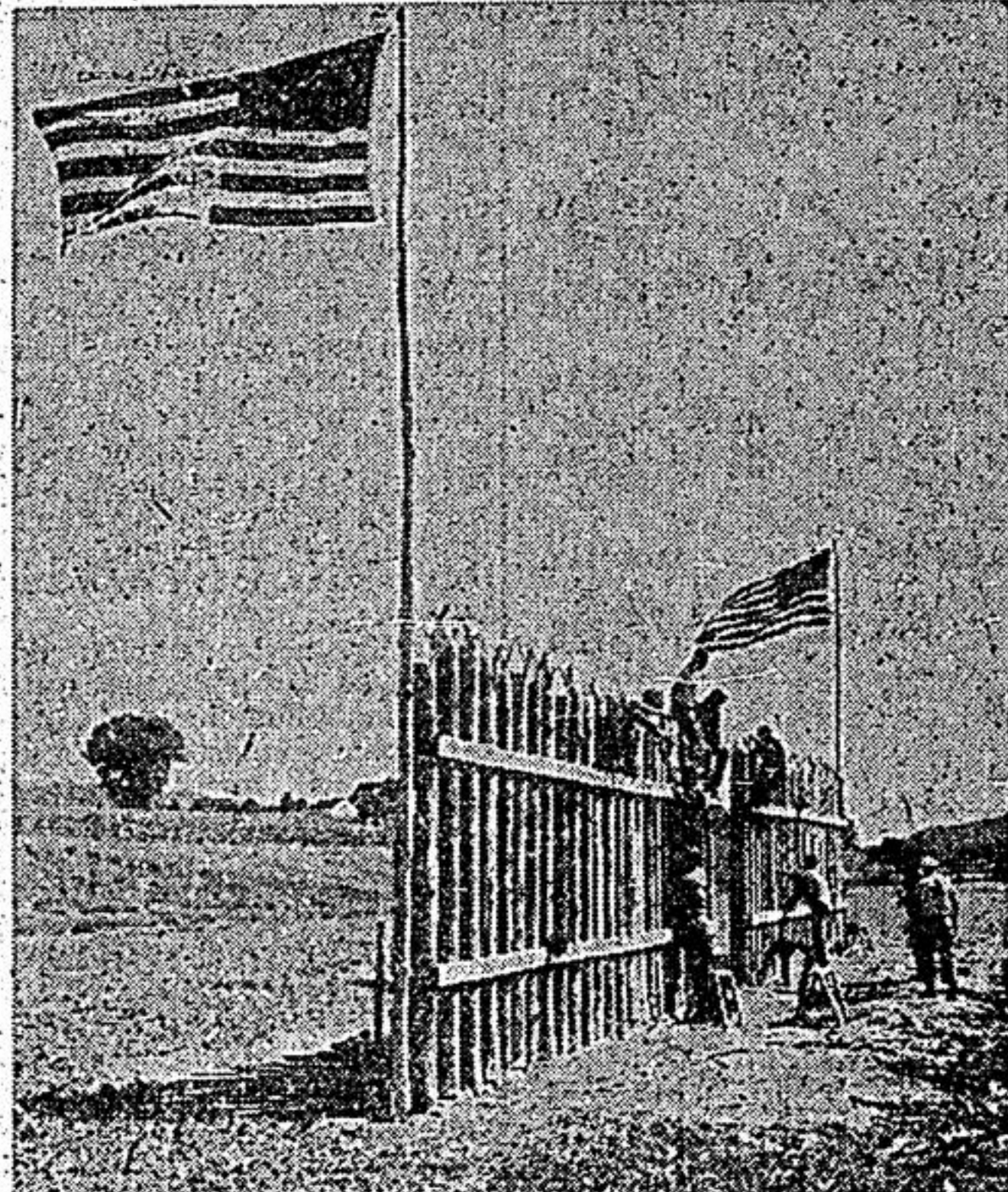
Symbolic of the Four Demon Kings is this figure.



A nun pays homage at figure of Laughing Buddha.



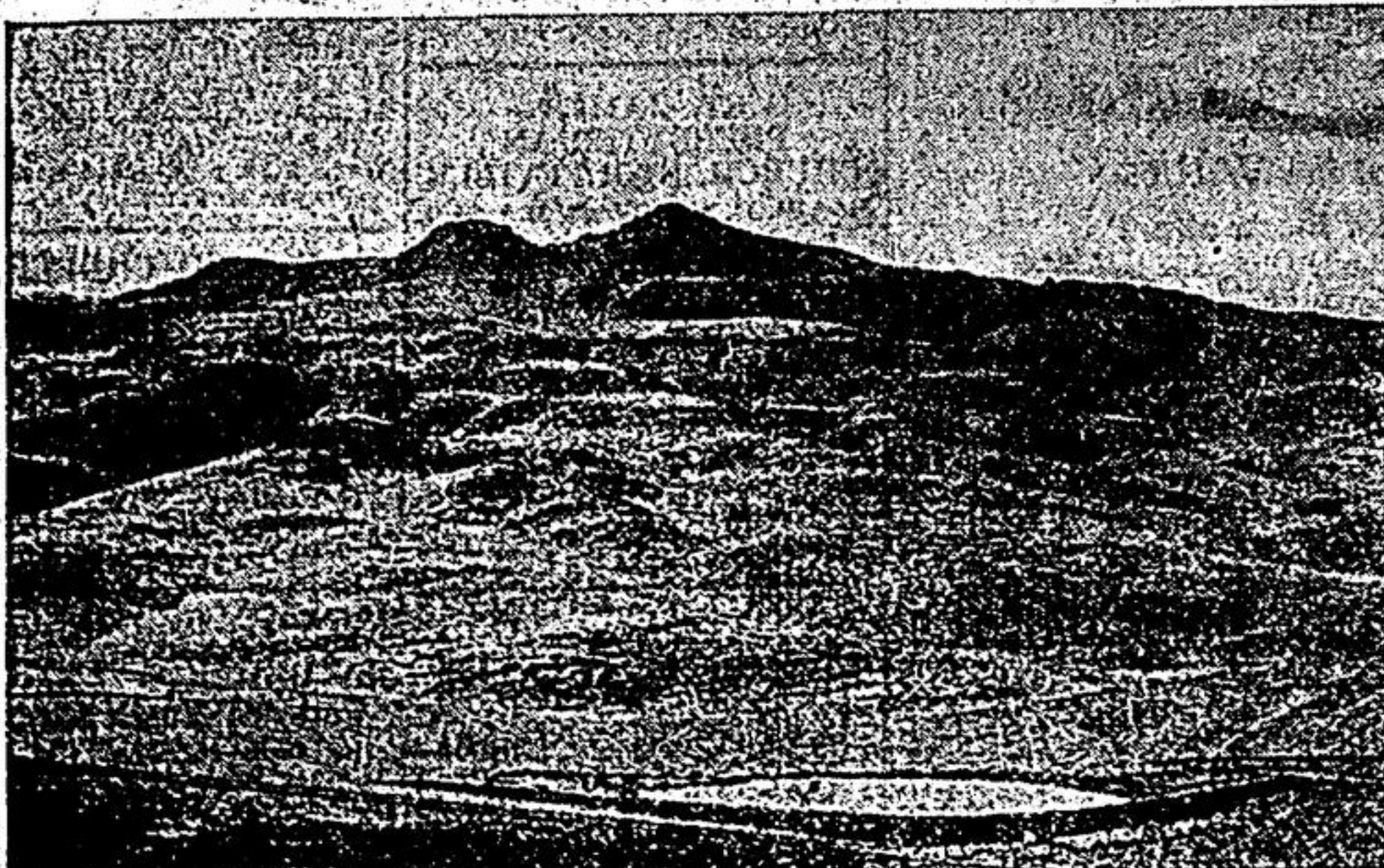
