

"Jets" Lose to Dixie 8-4

The Unionville "Jets" jumped into a two goal lead in the first period but faded in the middle frame to lose 8-4 to Dixie on Tuesday night.

Wayne Redshaw put Unionville out front 1-0 and Don Haynes hit the target at the

15:30 mark to give the "Jets" a two goal advantage. Dixie roared back in the dying minutes of the frame to even the count. Auger and Coburn were the marksmen.

The remainder of the game saw the visitors outscore Unionville 6-2. Auger and Jacobs each potted a pair for the winners. Bob Davidson and Jim Ferris blinked the light for the "Jets".

Proposes Consideration Of County Police Force

Deputy-Reeve C. Reesor, of Markham, was supported by Reeve J. H. Anderson of Geometric Courts and the Newmarket, York County Council, when he asked council to give 1959 members the opportunity of investigating further the formation of a County Police Force controlled by a County Police Commission. During the next two or three years, a way must be found to prevent overlapping of police services. R. H. Taylor, Richmond Hill, and members from the Markham-Vaughan-Richmond Hill area, agreed. All these sections of York County have their own police forces and police chiefs.

Since York County's original contract with Newmarket Police Force, four new courts were established in Maple, Markham, Vaudor and Aurora. Another will be starting in Sutton in the near future. In 1956 there were two courts in Newmarket, the York County Juvenile and Domestic. He requires larger of ket Court. Chief Burbidge's report to council considers transportation of prisoners from these new courts an added burden, when administrative duties are heavy and working space limited. He requires larger office quarters and two extra policemen. If he is to give adequate policing to Newmarket and York County.

"Newmarket citizens are thinking that York County is getting away with pretty cheap services at the expense of the town. The upkeep of the Newmarket police has upped the town's budget to \$51,000. That is too much for a population of 8,200. Court is held every day now, not twice weekly as at first," said Jack Luck.

Chief Burbidge submitted his 1958 budget of \$14,000, showing expenses, up to September 30, at \$8,778.45. During this year, 882 prisoners have passed through the cells to appear at County Court in Newmarket, Ontario Prov. Police transported prisoners, numbering 209, from Newmarket to Don Jail and vice versa. Of 137 break-ins investigated 28 were in Markham twp., 28 in North Gwillimbury and 15 in Richmond Hill. Nine were investigated by Newmarket Police in Aurora, but King Township and Whitchurch were not included in the report.

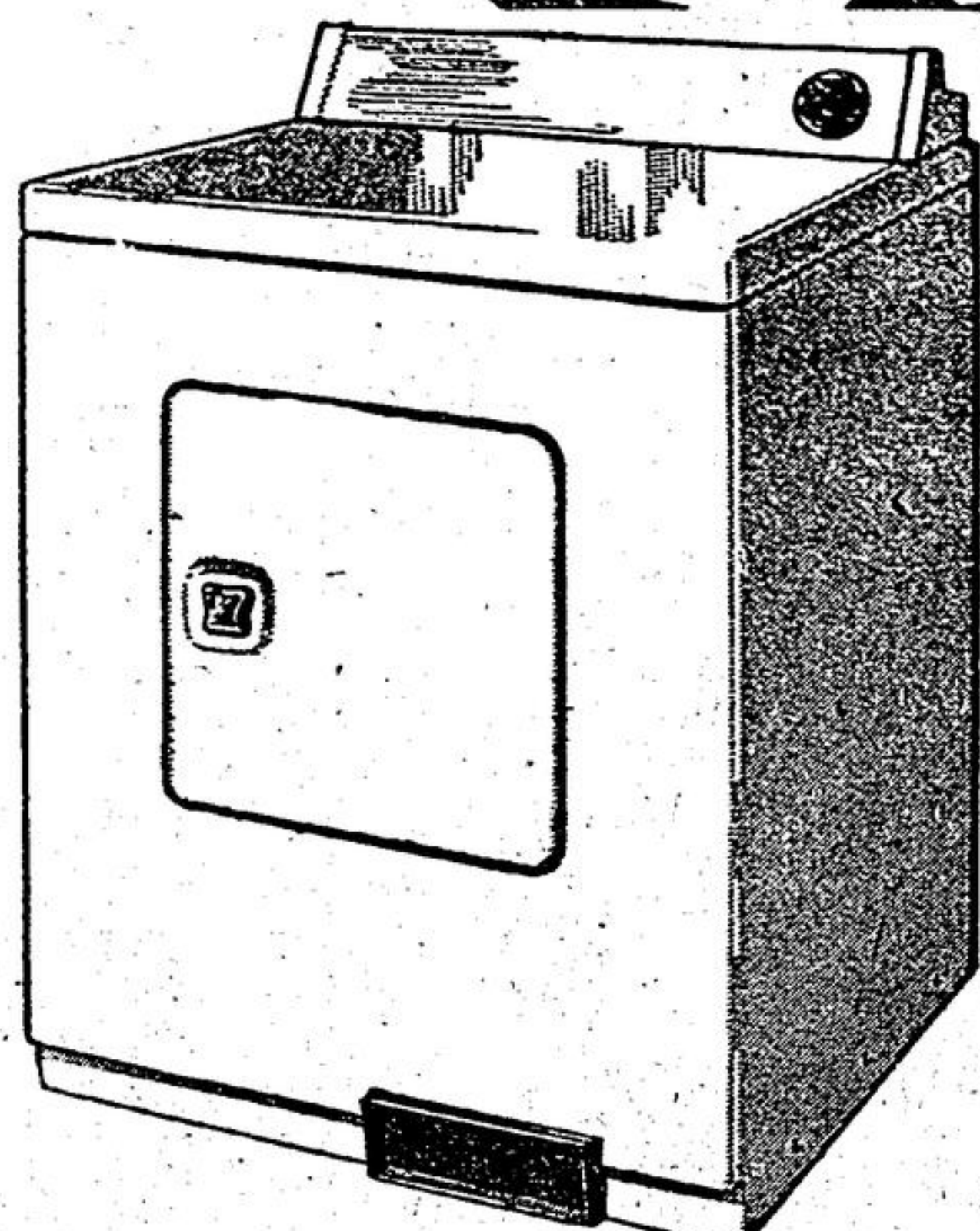

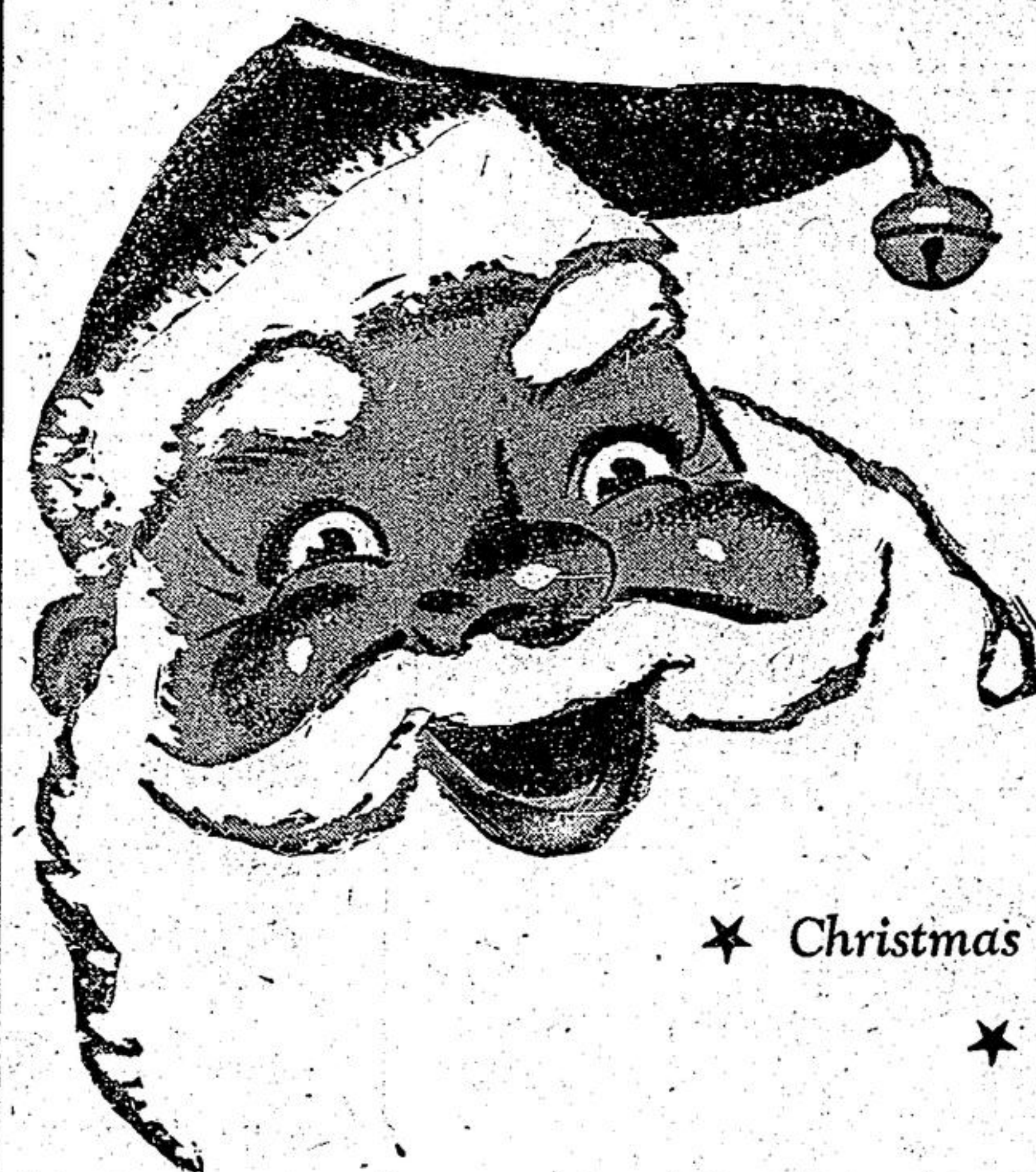
