Brown's Corner United Church Annual Meeting

It was an interesting evening at Brown's Corner United Church on Tuesday of last week when members met to assess the work of 1958.

Early in the year the congregation welcomed a new minister to its fellowship in the person of Rev. A. F. Binnington, who with Mrs. Binnington and his son Allan is making a fine contribution to the community.

The total membership roll included 134 resident members and 51 non-resident. There were seven who joined the church by transfer and one who entered on profession of faith; one member's name was removed in transfer and one was lost by death. Seven baptisms, two weddings and one funeral complete the vital statistics.

The only major improvement to church property was the acoustic tiling of the basement ceiling. This project was completed by volunteer labour.
