Cat Veal
Calf Costs
 Most farmers agree that nothing beats whole milk as a feed for growing out veal calves quickly. Packers pay top prices for the creamy white milk that straight whole milk feeding produces. But two questions often arise: Is whole milk the most profitable feed, and what's the best way to feed milk?
 O.A.C. dairy researchers tried 8 different feeding systems on 32 Holstein bull calves. The treatments tried were whole milk, pail fed; whole milk fed for three weeks, then re-constituted skim milk; milk replacer and nurse cows. These 4 treatments were tested with and without supplements to make up the full eight systems. Here is what they found.
 Calves on nurse cows made the fastest daily gains (2.44 lbs.)
 Calves on milk replacer made the slowest gains.
 Average gain for all treatments was 1.70 pounds per day.
 Hay and concentrate supplements increased the daily gain of milk replacer and skim-milk calves, and increased the dressing percentage of skim-milk calves the most.
 Nurse calves had the highest dressing percentage, 60%.
 Average dressing percentage for all other calves was 54.2%.
 Market prices were highest for the whole-milk fed calves—\$22.72 per 100 lbs. live weight.
 Calves fed skim-milk supplemented with concentrate and hay made the biggest profits.

Merlin Grove Among Bible School Grads
 The Annual Graduation Exercises of Toronto Bible College will be held on Friday, April 24, at 8 p.m. in Varsity Arena. Fifty-three students will receive degrees, diplomas and certificates. This number includes 13 who will receive the degree of Bachelor of Theology, 33 who will be awarded the College diploma for their 3-year course, two who have completed the special one-year course for outgoing missionary candidates, and two from the Toronto and three from the Hamilton Evening Class three-year courses.
 Among those receiving diplomas and certificates will be Mr. Merlin Grove, of Markham.
 The present Graduating Class has a wide international and inter-denominational personnel. Eight countries are represented among the forty-eight Day Class students—England, New Zealand, Mexico, British West Indies, Germany, China, The United States and Canada. The entire student body is drawn from twenty-two different church denominations. There are twelve denominations represented in the Graduating Class of 1959. These young people represent all walks of life, though many come to T.B.C. from the professions of medicine and teaching. A large percentage of them will be entering full-time Christian service as ministers, missionaries, deaconesses, Sunday School teachers, and as leaders in their churches.
 Since last Graduation, an additional four T.B.C. graduates have sailed for Africa; five to South America, two to Free China, two to the British West Indies, one to India, and one to Germany.
 The College Principals, the Rev. E. L. Simmonds, will lead the Graduation Service, and will assist the President, Mr. Wm. Inrig, in the presentation of diplomas. On the basis of outstanding proficiency and character, McNicol scholarships and scholarships from the Alumni Association, will be awarded.
 Degrees will be granted this year for the first time in T.B.C.'s long history. These will be conferred at a special Convocation which will be held in the College auditorium on Thursday, April 23rd, at 8 p.m.
 Founded in 1894, Toronto Bible College is the oldest Bible College in Canada. Of its 3,000 graduates, hundreds are serving in fifty-four countries, and nearly two hundred occupy pulpits in Canada and the United States. Local Toronto Missions, such as Yonge Street, Scott, Bungalow Hall, and Railway, all serve to give the undergraduates needed experience in practical work while they pursue their studies.
 The sound-colour film entitled "Word of Life," is available to churches, young people's groups and other meetings upon request. This film vividly portrays student life, and embodies in its title an excerpt from the motto of the College, "Holding Forth The Word of Life."
 Suva, the capital of Fiji, is one of the busiest cities in the Pacific. A center of trade and commerce, Suva straddles air and sea lanes between Australia and the North American continent. Its population numbers 37,000.
