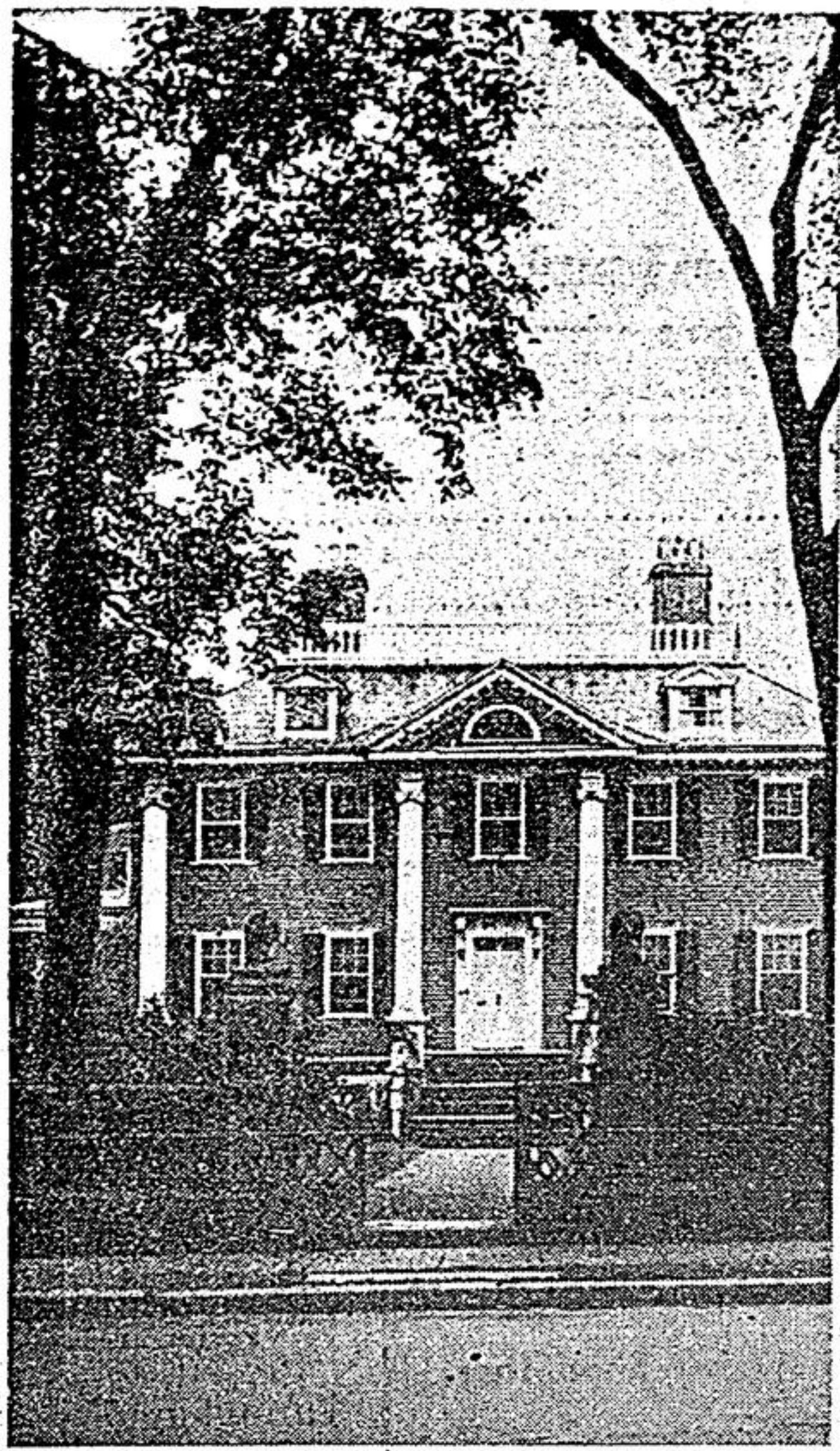
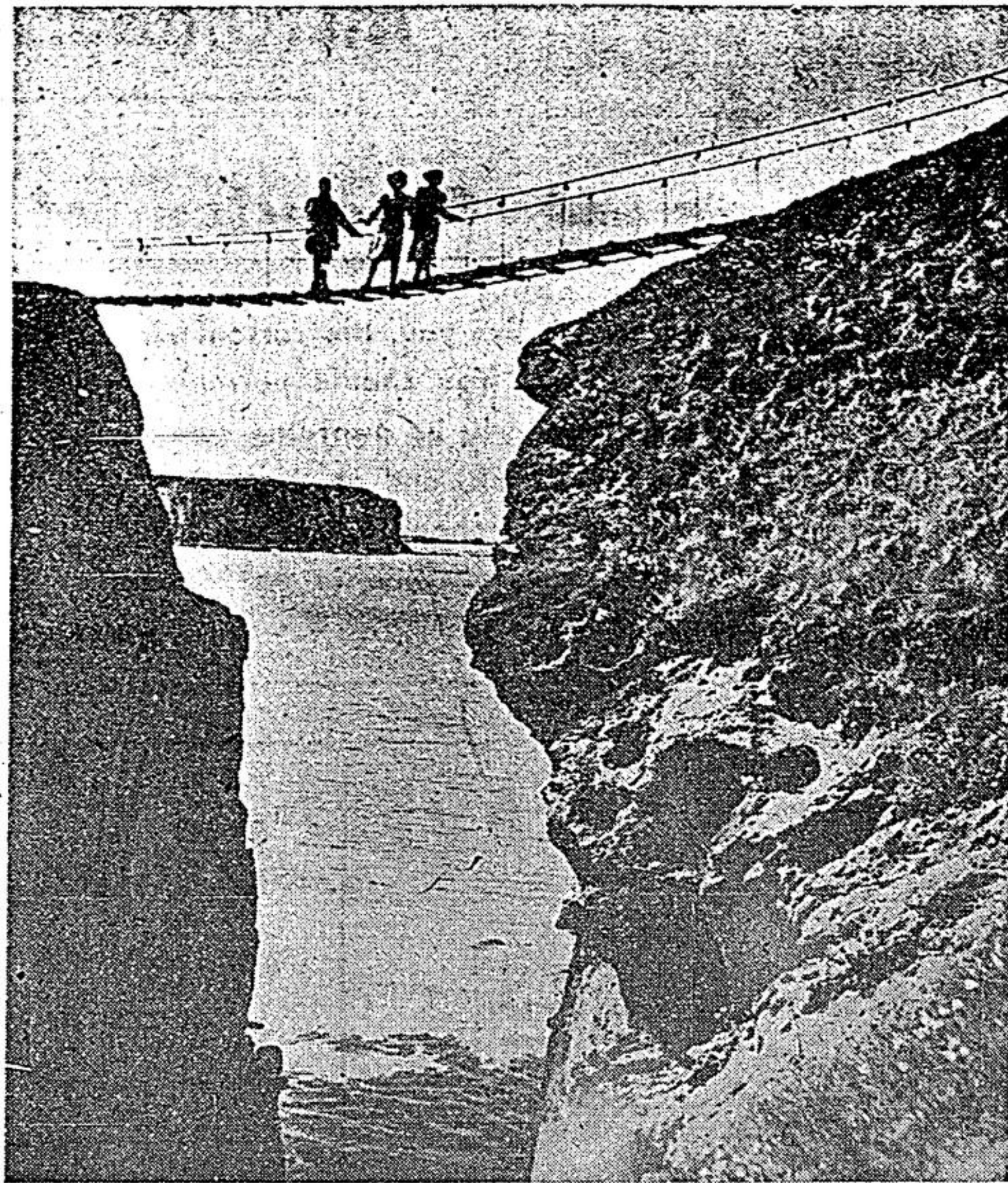

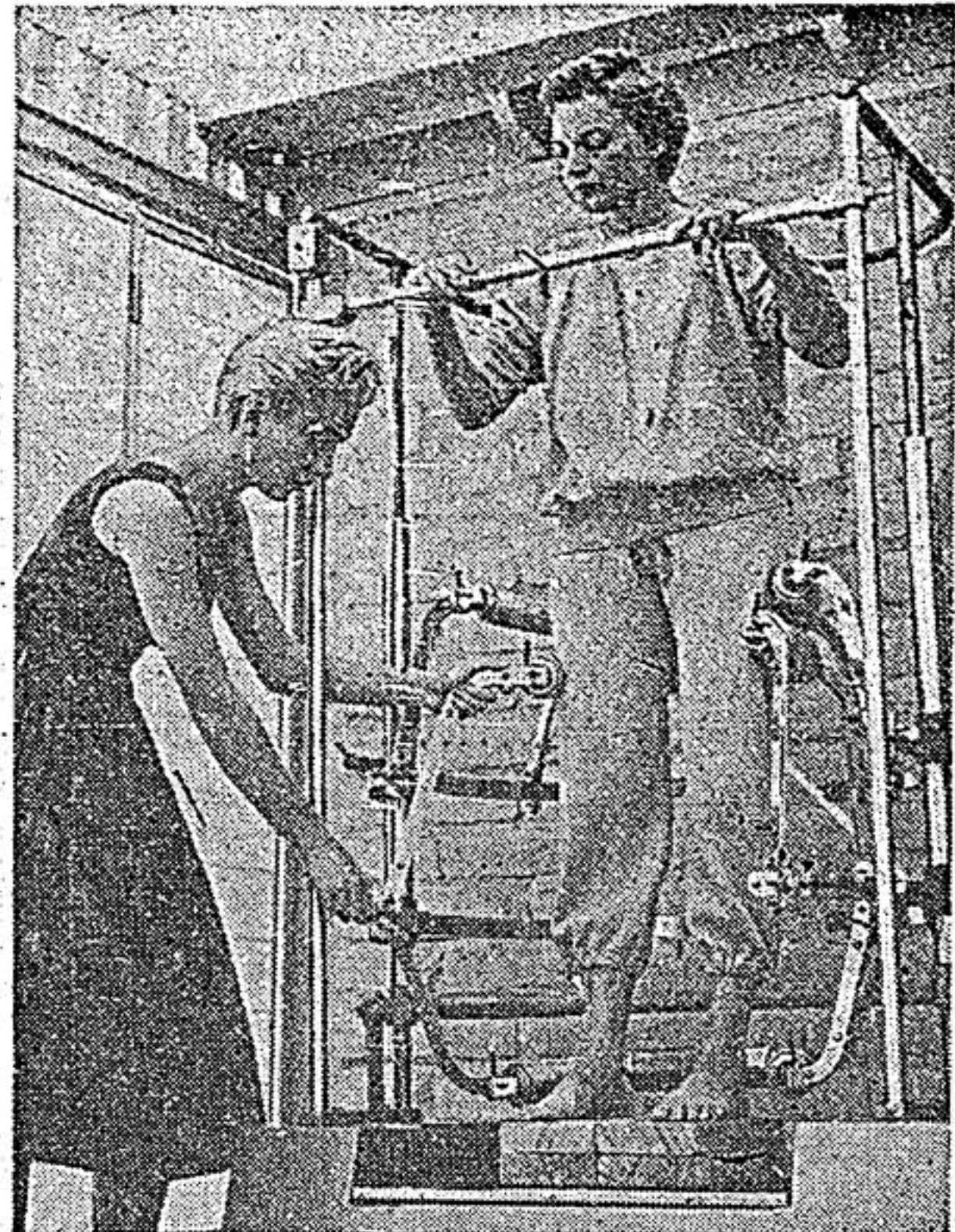

PUBLIC FIGURE

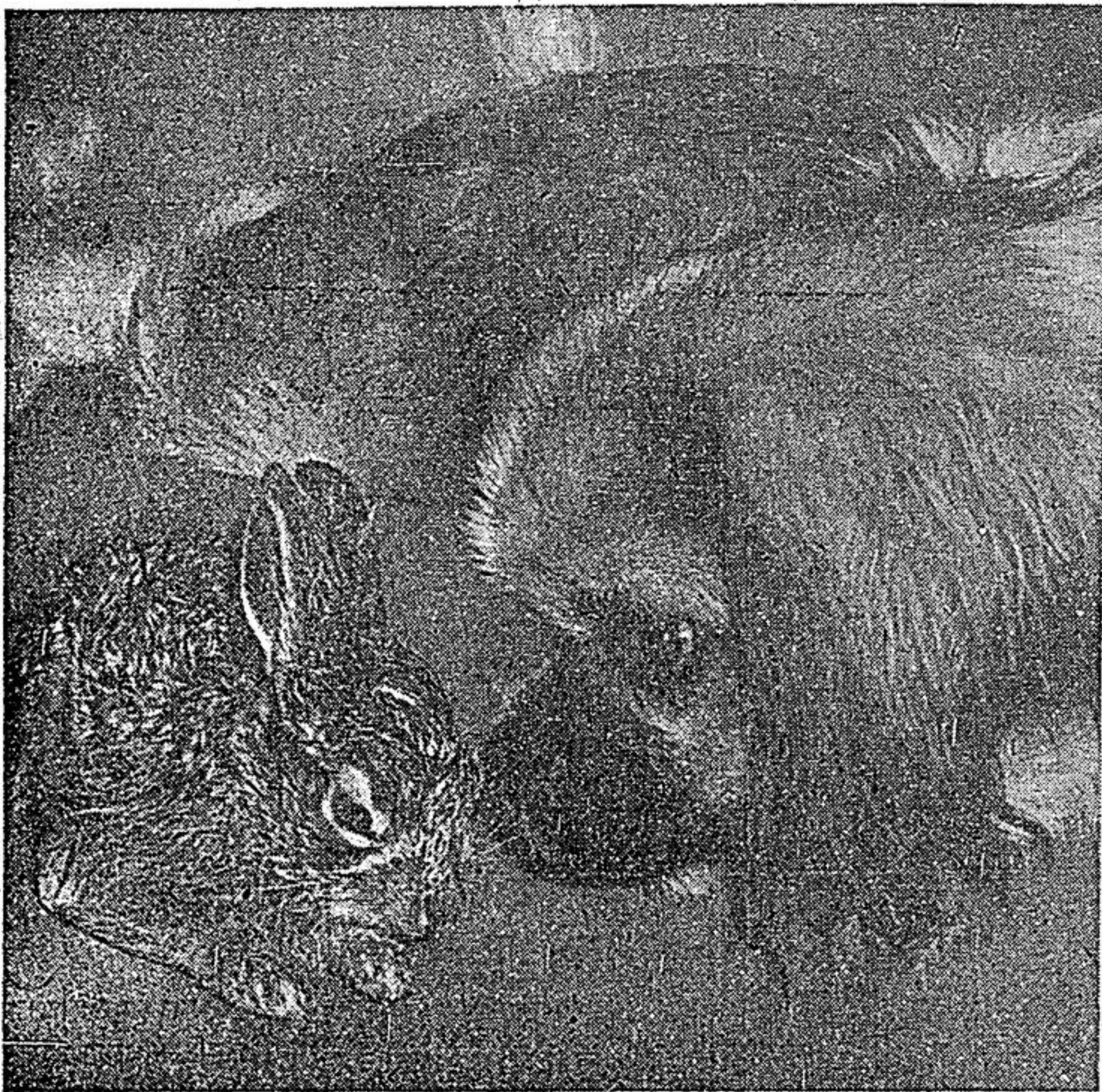

She's her pretty self now.



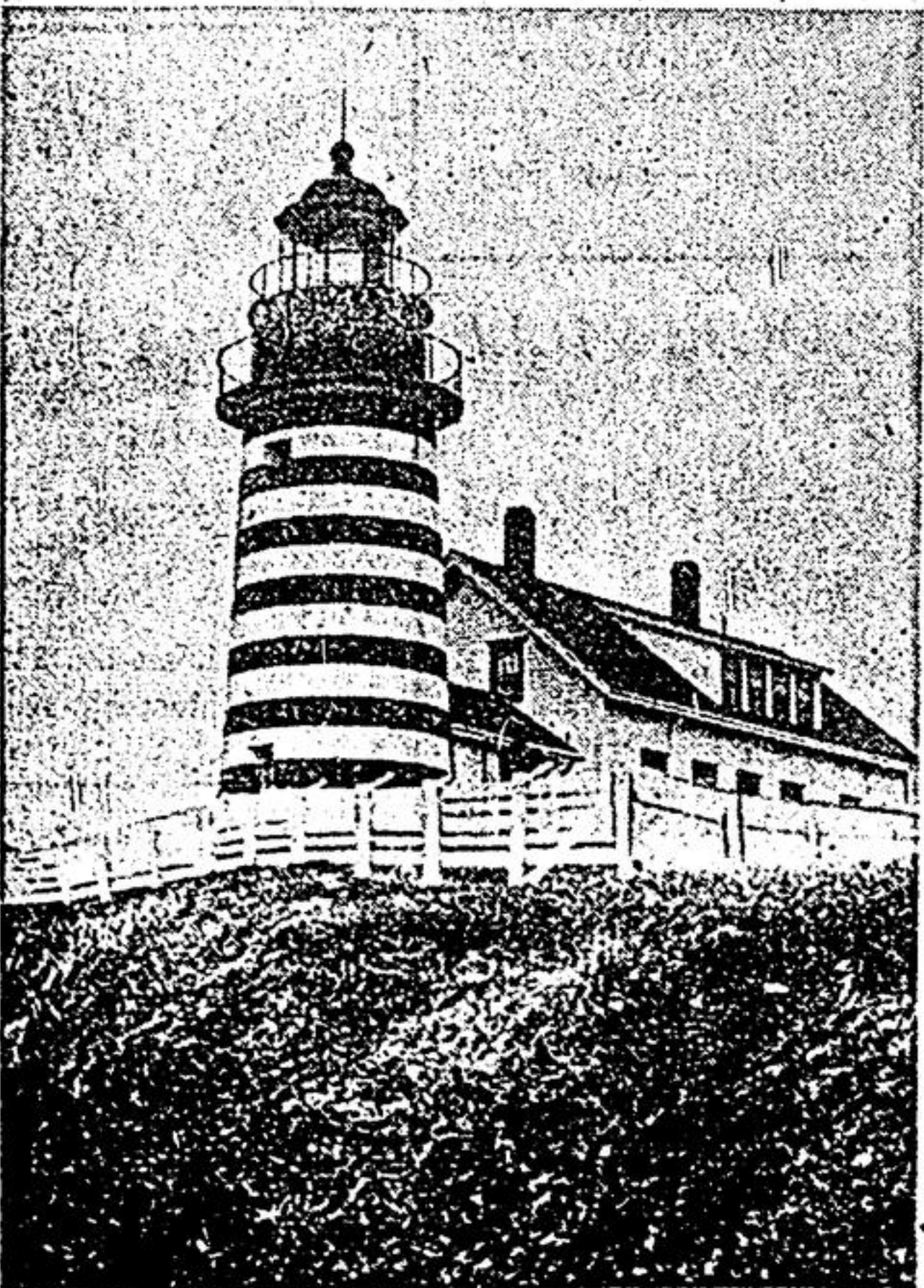

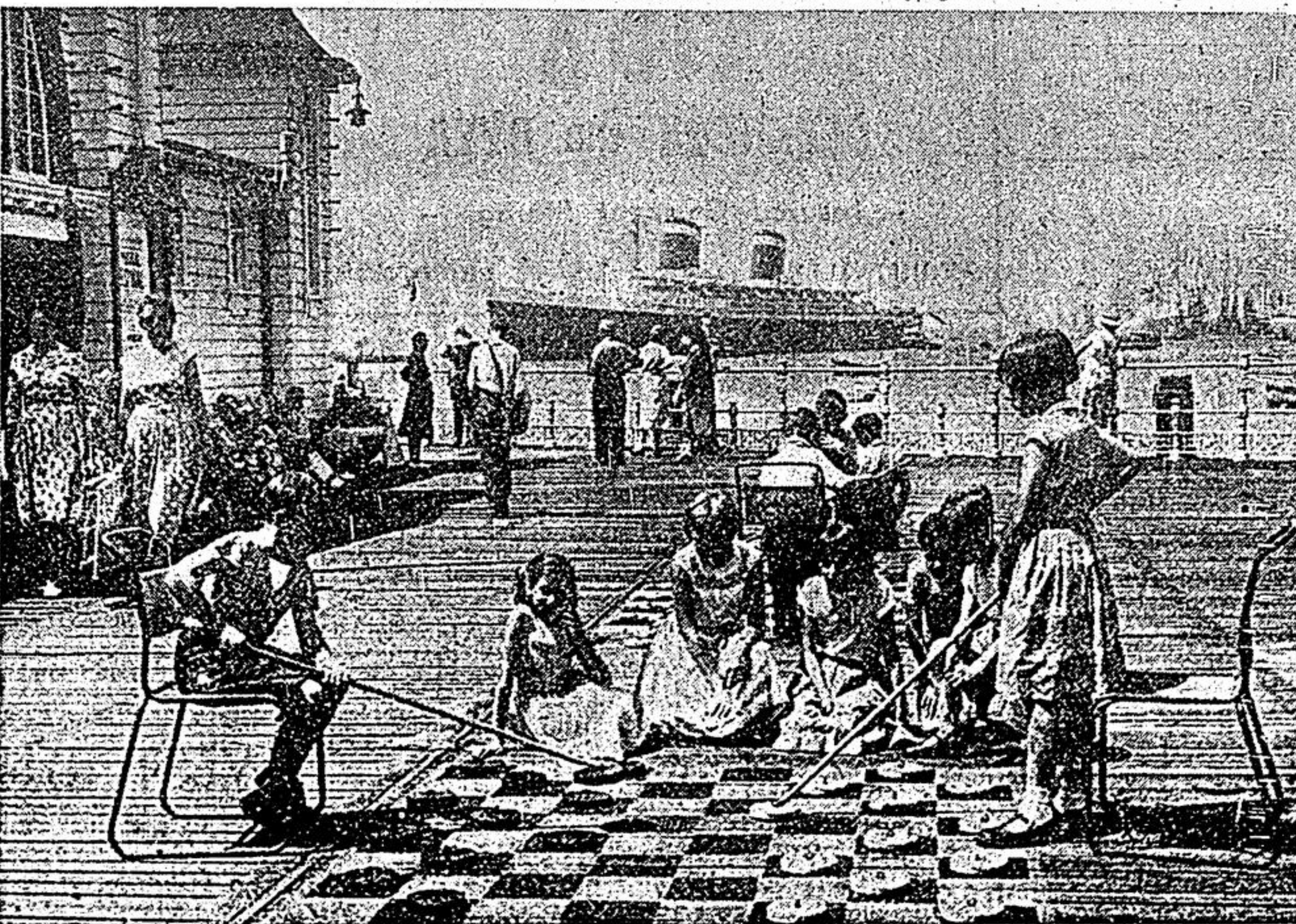
