Recommend Minimum Fall Crop Prices

Minimum prices for seed of fall crops were recommended at a recent meeting, Seed Marketing & Publicity Committee, Ontario Soil & Crop Improvement Association, as follows:

	(per bus.)
Winter Wheat—Registered No. 1	\$2.75
Certified No. 1	2.60
Commercial No. 1	2.40
Rye—(Tetra Petkus) Commercial No. 1	2.00
Winter Barley, Hudson Variety Registered No. 1	2.50
Certified No. 1	2.35
Commercial No. 1	2.00

These suggested minimum prices are for treated seed in new bags, at farm or local shipping point. The Committee also recommended to the Ontario Wheat Producers' Marketing Board that Pedigreed Seed Wheat, sealed as Registered and Certified Grades, be exempt from equalization fees. Genesee is now the principal variety grown. There is increased interest in Winter Barley of the Hudson Variety, and Tetra Petkus Rye, with some feeders now using Rye as 40% for hogs and 30% for cattle in feed mixtures. Rye is also being used extensively, particularly on light soils, as a winter cover crop, organic matter and soil fertility build-up, silage and pasture.

Pheasant Seasons Announced

Pheasant hunting seasons for Ontario, with the exception of Essex County, were announced Wednesday by the lands and forests department.

The season for Essex, one of the province's best pheasant areas, will be announced later along with possession limits for the whole of the province.

The daily bag limit is three birds, of which only one may be a hen, except in North Norwich Township in Oxford County where the limit is three cocks only. Hunting hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The seasons are:

Oct. 17-21: Oxford County.
Oct. 14-31: Counties of Brant, Bruce, Dufferin, Grey, Halton, Huron, Peel, Perth, Waterloo, Simcoe, Wellington and Wentworth; Ontario County except for townships of East Whitby, Pickering and Whitby.

Oct. 21-31: Townships of East Gwillimbury, King, Markham,

Vaughan and Whitchurch in York County and townships of East Whitby, Pickering and Whitby in Ontario County.

Oct. 24-Nov. 7: Counties of Elgin, Haldimand, Kent, Lambton, Lincoln, Middlesex, Norfolk and Welland.

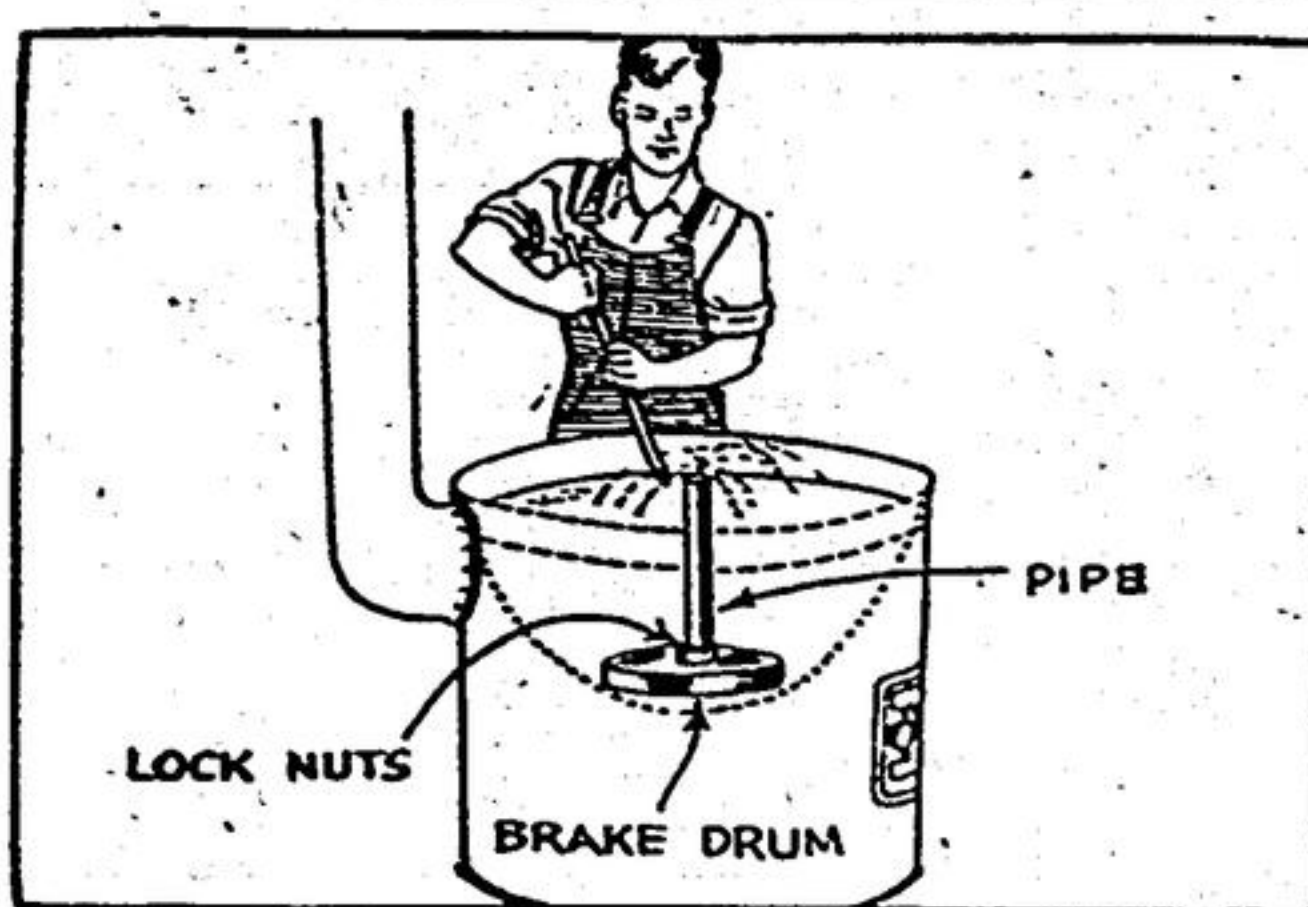
Oct. 10-31: The remainder of the province except for Essex County.
