will be the metropolis of the kingdom to be established; (2) God will once more be knit to His people in the bonds of fellowship; (3) righteousness will once more prevail in the land.
Verse 12—"For the seed shall give her fruit, and the ground . . . her increase, . . . the heavens . . . their dew; and I will cause all these . . ." "The seed of peace" (Heb.) will be sown. The presence of God with His people will result not only in happiness, truth, and righteousness, but also in peace and material prosperity. Both earth and heaven will co-operate in bringing benediction to the people of the Lord.
Verse 13—" . . . as ye were a curse among the heathen, O . . . Judah, and . . . Israel; so will I save you, and ye shall be a blessing: fear not, but let your hands be strong." "Heathen" is "nations" (Heb.). Note that the ten northern tribes (Israel) along with the 2 southern tribes (Judah) are here addressed. The "lost tribes" of the north will also be regathered. A sharp contrast; whereas the Hebrews had been a curse to their captors. This changeless hope was a challenge to Israel to abandon her fears and be strong.
The Heart of the Lesson
Two items should be strongly stressed. First, Zechariah opens the windows of prophecy and allows us an amazing view of the future. Israel's rejection of the Lord Jesus would bring renewed disaster upon her head. "And I will sow them among the people . . ." (10:9). The Jews would be scattered to the ends of the earth. How literally this prophecy has been fulfilled!
But Israel will, some day be regathered to her national home land (10:10). This we are beholden in our own day. Then after a lapse of time not specified in Zechariah, during which the New Testament Church age will run its course, the true Church will be caught up to be with Christ; then Antichrist will appear and the Great Tribulation occur. Christ the Lord will return to the earth to smite the nations and set up His kingdom. (See Rev. 19:11, 15).
Jerusalem will be besieged by her enemies (Zech. 12: 2). The Lord Jesus will return to rescue His people and overthrow their foes (12:4-9; 14:1-7). When the Jews in the land behold their Deliverer (12:10), they will repent of their sins and be cleansed. Christ will then set up His earthly, universal kingdom with Jerusalem as its center (14:9-21). Happiness, long life and

prosperity will abound (8:1-13). And at long last peace, the long-coveted but often ephemeral desire of nations, will be ushered in. And why not? For the Prince of Peace will have arrived.
But Zechariah emphasizes a second truth, too. God-rejected and scattered His people Israel because of their flagrant refusal to heed His holy law and the voice of His prophets (7:8-14). Rebellion against the Lord invariably bring dire results. Let us of a later day ever be sensitive to the will of our God!
