## Private Co. Would Take Over Bus Line

At the regular monthly meeting of the Co-ordinating Committee of Richmond Hill, Markham and Vaughan, held in the Markham Township council chambers on Wednesday evening of last week, the committee had an informal session with Mr. Larry Needlar to discuss the possibility of the privately owned Newmarket Bus Lines providing a North Yonge bus service, similar to that now operated by the T.T.C. The present agreement with the T.T.C. is up for renewal and pending a report from the solicitor for the municipalities, as well as a report from the T.T.C. auditor regarding cost-per-mile-per-passenger for bus service from Richmond Hill to Steeles Avenue, the co-ordinating committee is investigating other avenues of service, unofficially. Reeve John Perry said at a meeting of Vaughan Township council on Monday last week, "It should be made perfectly clear the co-ordinating committee is not drawing any conclusion yet regarding bus service. We have promised the T.T.C. we will hear their auditor's report. We do not wish to jeopardize our good standing with them, in having the T.T.C. believe we are negotiating with other parties before their report is presented and acted upon." The Newmarket bus line, which presently travels on the east side of Richmond Hill down Bayview to Steeles Ave., across
