**Markham Awaits Metro Plan With Interest**

Markham Township Council was advised by letter this week that the Metro Planning Board is preparing a Master Plan to cover the entire Metro area, including the fringe municipalities. Council members expressed interest in what this will mean to the plans and developments which have already been started.

"I have heard that our industrial area is being cut down," declared Dep-Reeve Dean. Other councillors expressed concern that they had heard rumours of unfavorable changes, but no definite information was forthcoming.

Metro advised that their plan would be ready within a few weeks.

**School Debenture**

Council gave two readings to a debenture issue of \$152,279.64 which is Markham's share of a new high school to be built in the Markham-Richmond Hill district. Total cost of the school exceeds three quarters of a million dollars.

Council has requested an interim road subsidy grant from the Dept. of Highways of \$196,006 to cover the government's share of road expenditures from January until the end of August.
