IMPORTANT NOTICE re ZONING BY-LAWS of The Corporation of the Township of Whitchurch

TAKE NOTICE that an application has been made to The Ontario Municipal Board for approval of By-law No. 1643 passed by Council on the 16th day of July, 1959, and that the Board has granted an appointment for the hearing of the application on Monday the 2nd day of November, 1959, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, (Local Time) at the Township Council Chambers in Vandonr, Ontario.

The purpose of this by-law is to remove any doubts as to the validity of certain restricted area repealing or amending by-laws heretofore passed by the Council of the Corporation and approved by The Ontario Municipal Board which might be raised as the result of a recent judgment of the Supreme Court of Canada.

The regulations contained in this new by-law are identical to those contained in by-laws previously passed by the Council of the Corporation certified copies of which are attached thereto as a schedule (or schedules), and which have been approved by formal orders of The Ontario Municipal Board to the extent set forth in such orders.

Each by-law included in the schedule (or schedules) is in the form which was eventually approved by the formal orders of The Ontario Municipal Board.

A copy of the above by-law and schedule (or schedules) thereto is available for inspection at the Clerk's Office during regular business hours.
