### 4-H Club Calves To Show In Queen's Guineas Class At Royal Winter Fair

The Queen's Guineas Class at the Royal Winter Fair has been an interesting event for a number of years, particularly to members of 4-H Beef Calf Clubs. Nearly a century ago the late King Edward VII, then Prince of Wales, created a fund for the development of agriculture in Ontario and placed it in trust with the Agricultural and Arts Society of Ontario. Later when the Agricultural and Arts Society ceased to exist, the fund was turned over to the Ontario Department of Agriculture to be kept in trust in perpetuity, the proceeds of which were to be awarded at the discretion of the Minister of Agriculture for Ontario.

The Queen's Fifty Guineas and the Honourable T. L. Kennedy Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor of the Champion Baby Beef Steer, owned and exhibited by a qualified member of the 4-H Clubs of Ontario. The exhibitor of the Champion Steer in each of the other breeds in this class, will be awarded a cash prize of \$100.00.

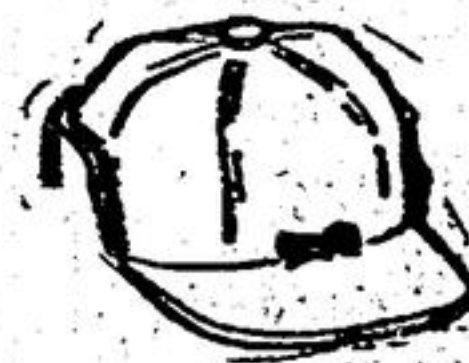

## TOWNSHIP OF MARKHAM NOMINATIONS And ELECTIONS

A meeting of the Municipal Electors of the Township of Markham will be held in the

Buttonville Womens' Institute Hall on Friday, November 27th

between the hours of 7 and 8 o'clock in the evening for the purpose of nominating candidates for Reeve, Deputy-Reeve, and Council for each of the Wards 1, 2 and 3, for the year 1960.

Nominations will also be held at the same time for the election of five members for the Board of Trustees, School Area No. 1, Markham Township; and three (3) members for the Board of Trustees to serve Markham Township School Area No. 2.

Every nomination must be in writing, on forms provided, and shall be signed by the Proposer and Seconder, both of whom shall be Municipal Electors and present at the meeting. When a proposed candidate is not present, his nomination paper shall not be valid unless there is attached thereto evidence satisfactory to the Returning Officer that he consents to be so nominated.

An election will be necessary, no matter what the outcome of the nomination meeting may be, due to a vote on the question of a two year term and will take place on:

Monday, Dec. 7th, 1959

between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and 8 o'clock p.m. in the polling places designated (see bills setting out Polling Sub-divisions). DATED November 9th, 1959.
