**Dr. Dymond Addresses P.C.'s at Sunderland**

Dr. M. B. Dymond, Ontario minister of health, told the annual meeting of the Ontario Riding Progressive Conservative Association in Sunderland last week that contrary to popular opinion, mental illness in the province of Ontario is decreasing.

He said the number of people whose mental condition required institutional care was declining each year. The minister said the percentage ratio of people in this category was dropping faster than the population was rising.

"There are now less than one percent of the population in mental institutions," he said.

Dr. Dymond said his department never pretended it could cure mental illness but said the work it had been doing offered help and solace to patients.

He said that great efforts to stem the tide of the disease were being made by researchers at the University of Western Ontario, to discover the cause of the most common forms of mental sickness.

"We hope that some day in the not too distant future this great goal will be achieved," he said.
