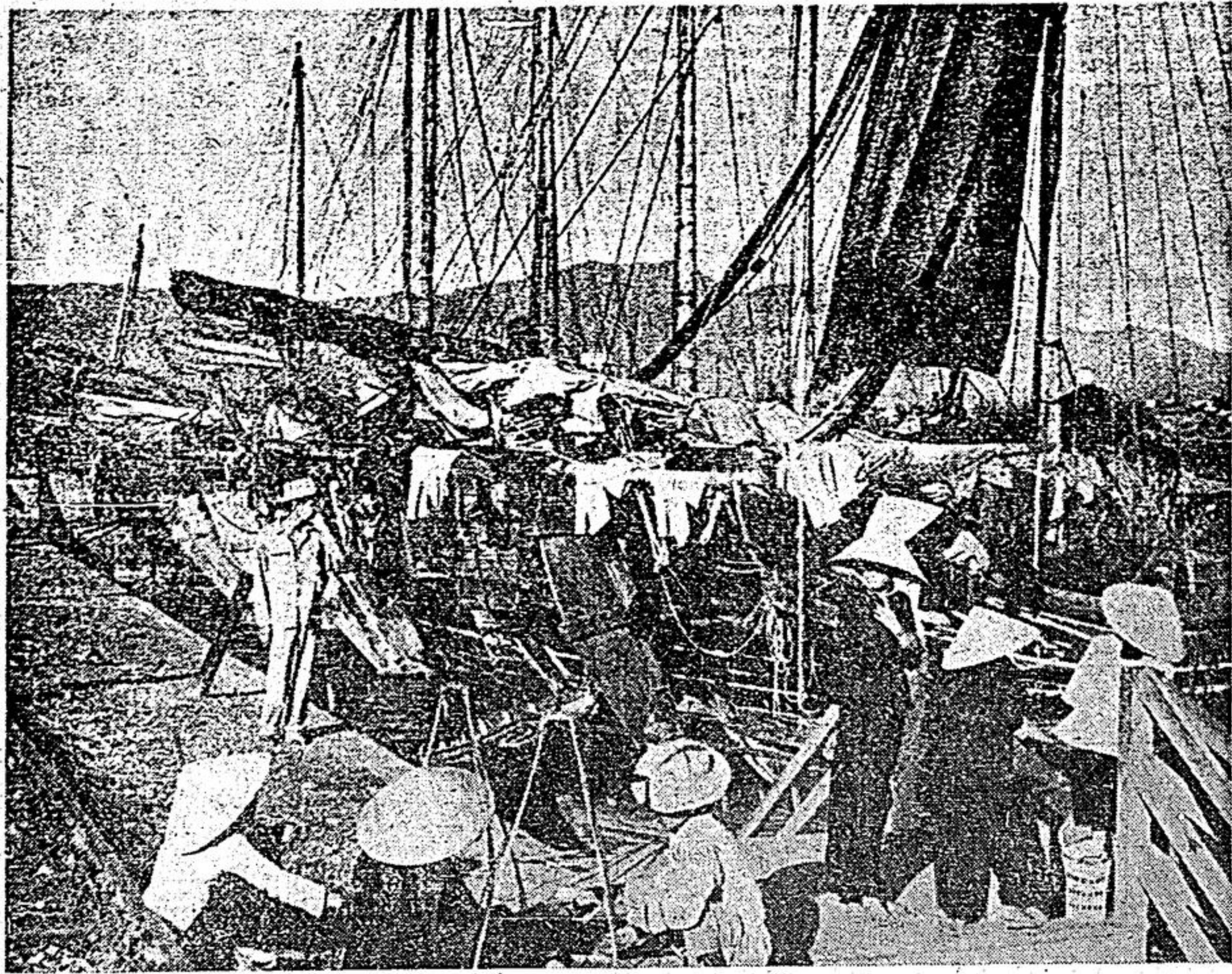
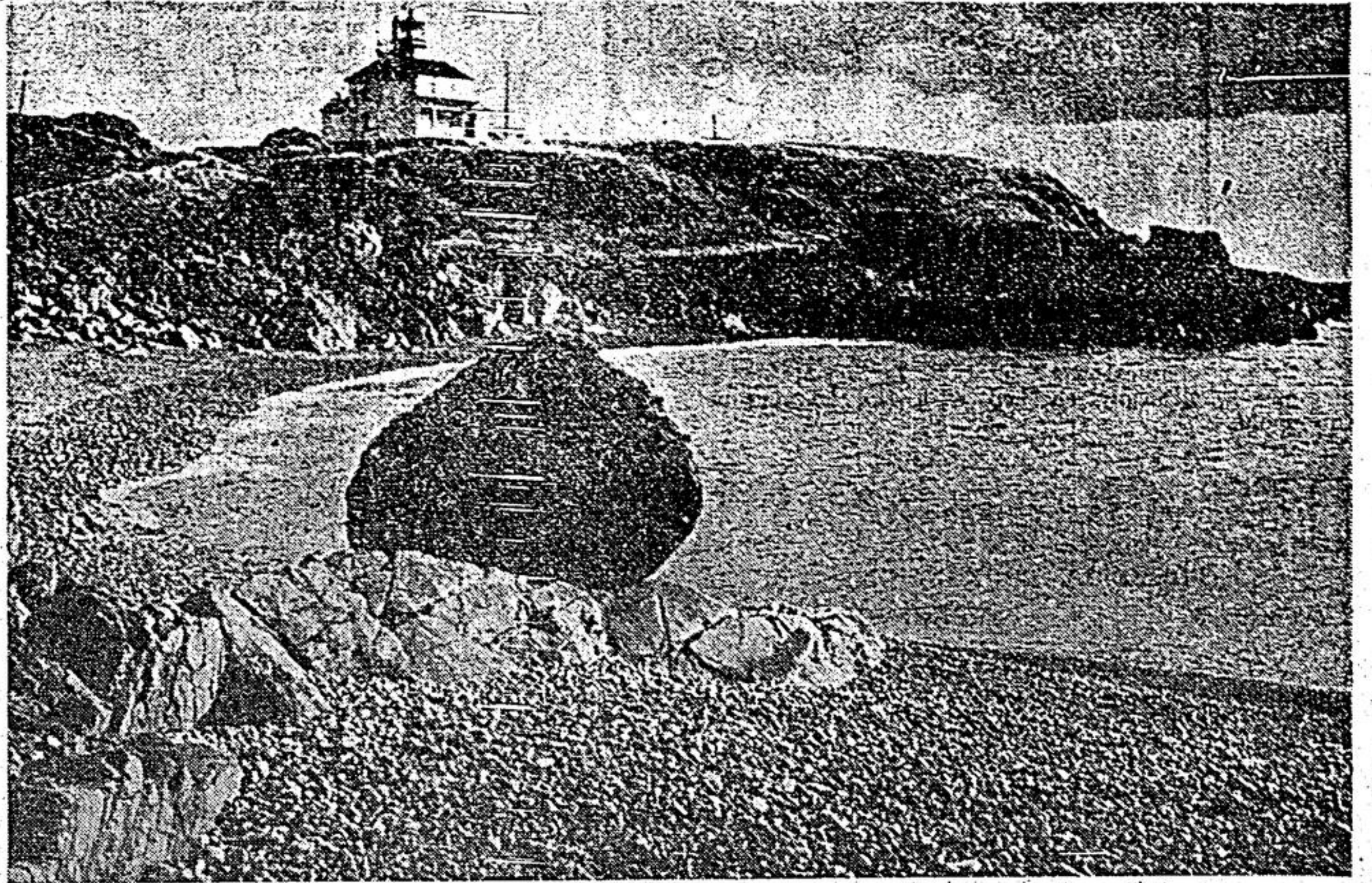

This is the Scatarri island lighthouse. Mrs. Campbell tends it alone since the death of her husband in 1942.



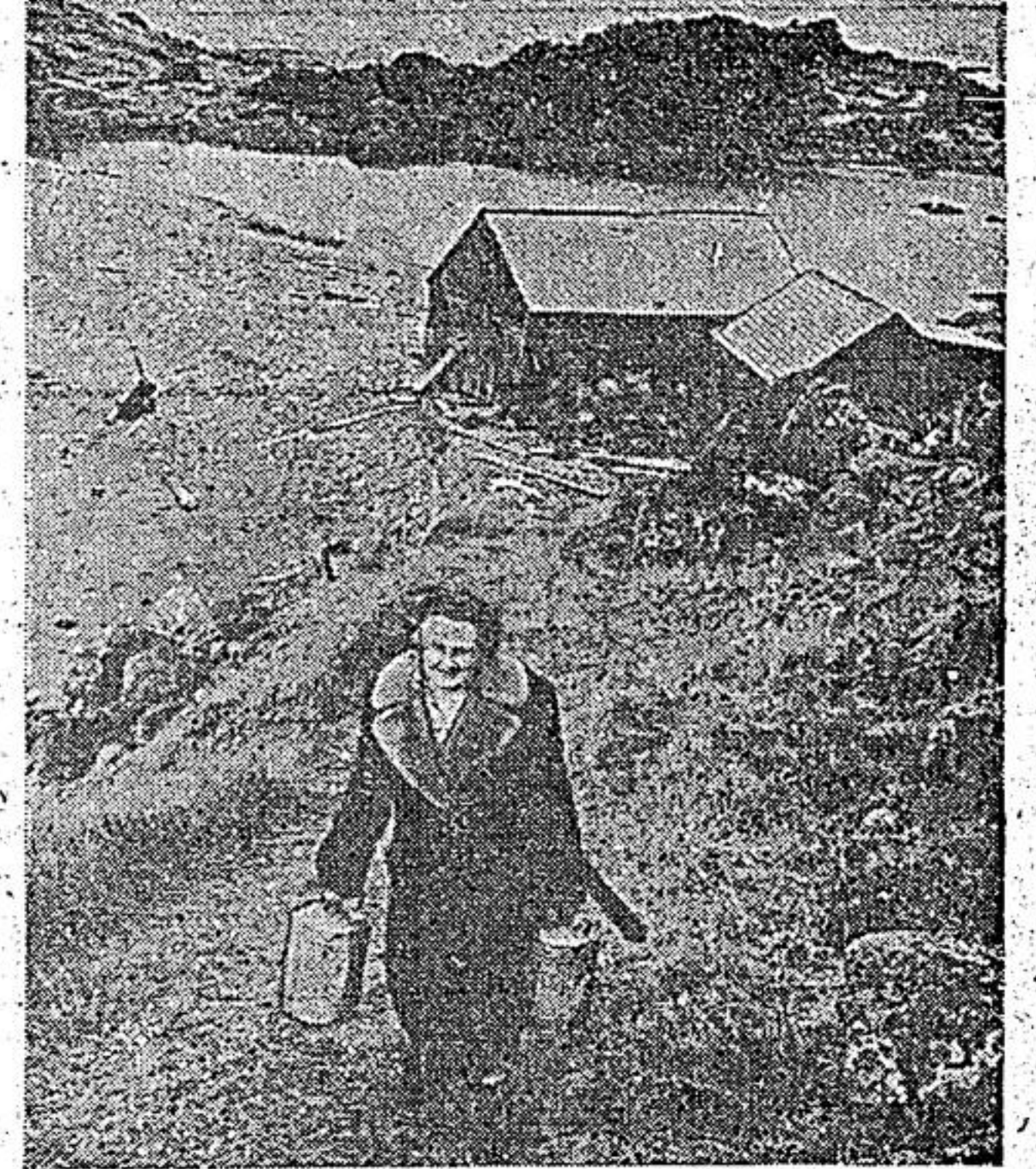

Checking the beacon is one of her lighthouse chores.

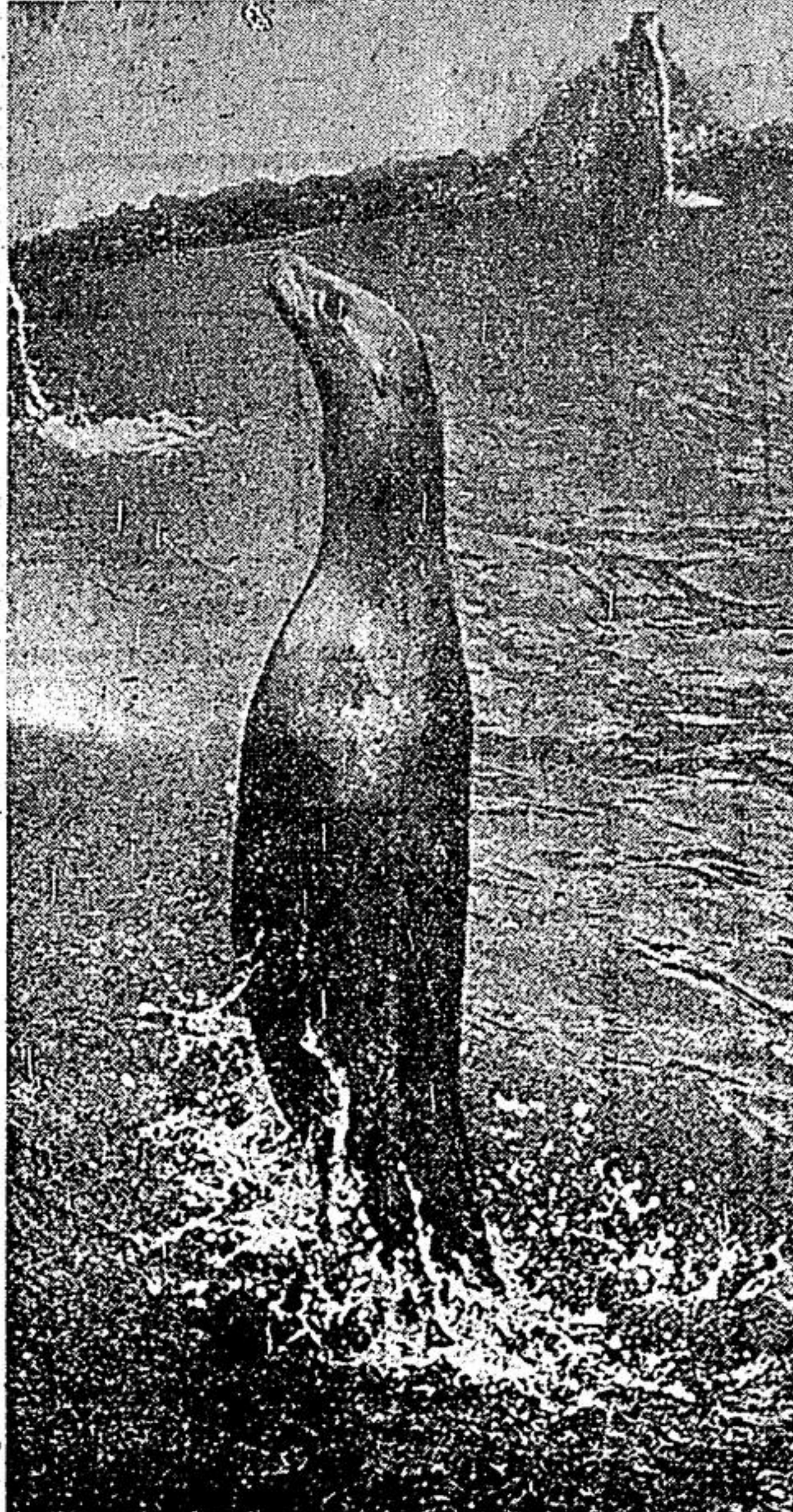

The government has converted most of Canada's lighthouses to automatic operation.
