

Await Government Approval of \$35 Million Flood Control Program

The fourth annual meeting of the Metropolitan Toronto & Region Conservation Authority, which saw the election of officers and the appointment of new members, was held today at York Township municipal offices.

The MTRCA administers the watersheds of the Etobicoke Creek, Mimico Creek, New Toronto Creek, Humber River, Don River, Rouge River, Highland Creek, Duffin's Creek and Petti-coat Creek lying within a 950-square mile area. The Authority is principally concerned with flood control, and presently is awaiting provincial government approval of its massive \$34,000,000 flood control program for the entire region.

Chairman of the Authority is Dr. G. Ross Lord, P. Eng., one of Canada's foremost flood control engineers, and head of the University of Toronto's mechan-

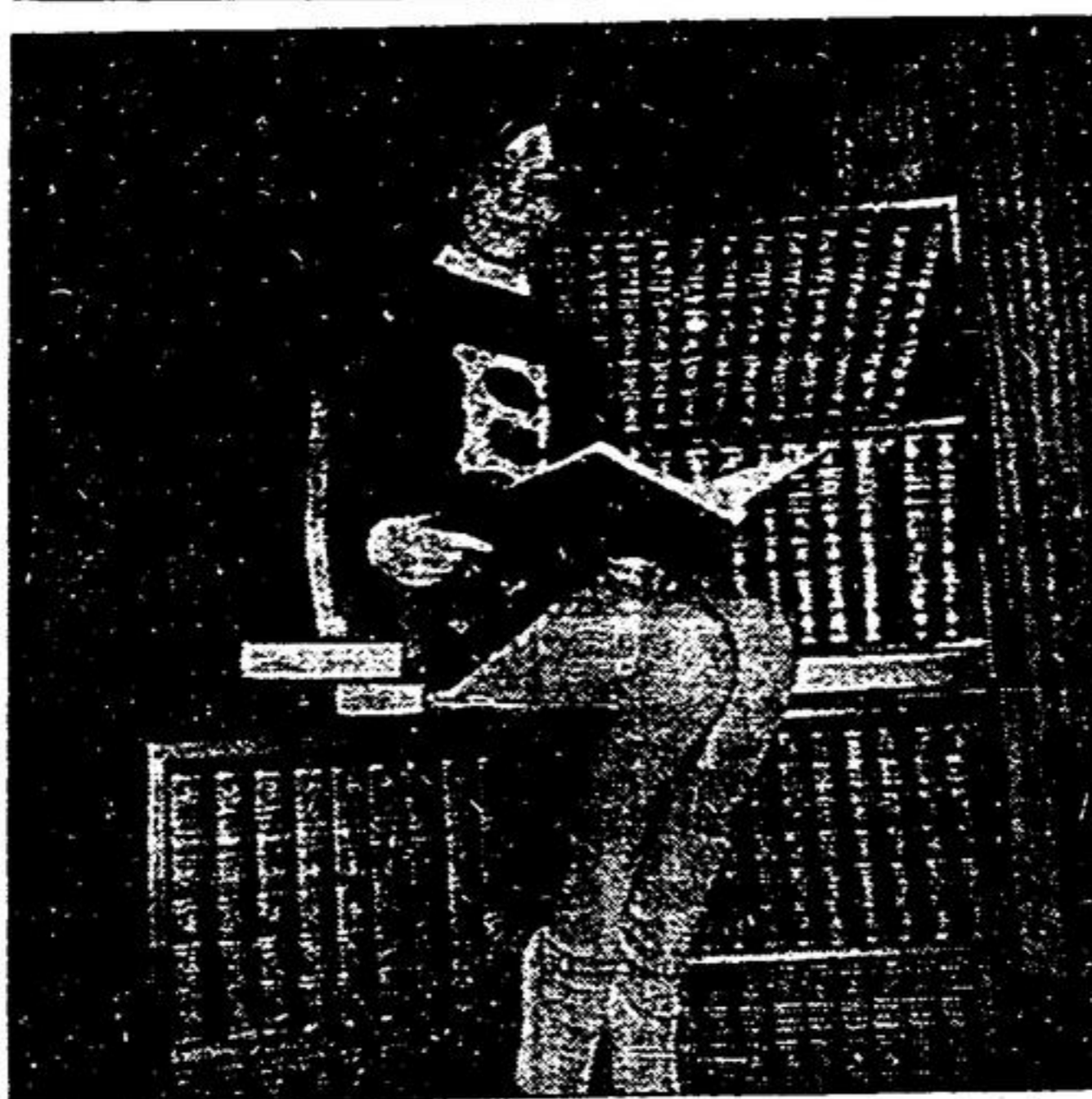
ical engineering department.

Hon. M. B. Dymond Addresses N. York PC's

The Honorable M. B. Dymond, M.D., who is addressing the North York Progressive Conservative Association Friday evening, February 19, at Newmarket Town Hall, has had an Alger-type career.

Still in his early 40's, he has been Ontario Minister of Reform Institutions, Minister of Transport and now Minister of Health. Health is one of the heaviest ministries of the government, having an employment roll (including provincial hospital staffs) of 10,000.

Dr. Dymond is notable, among other things, for his Aberdonian burr, his evangelistic fervor, for his humanitarian objectives and his ability as an administrator.

He came by all these characteristics honestly. Matt Dymond was born near Aberdeen and in his early teens decided to migrate to Canada. He worked for a year on a Scottish farm before the Salvation Army would sponsor his trip. It also enabled Matt to earn the required 25 pounds.

His first job in Canada as a boy of 15 was on a farm near Woodstock. It was here he began his studies in night and correspondence schools that led him to study for the ministry. He later changed to medicine. Medicine, however, won out

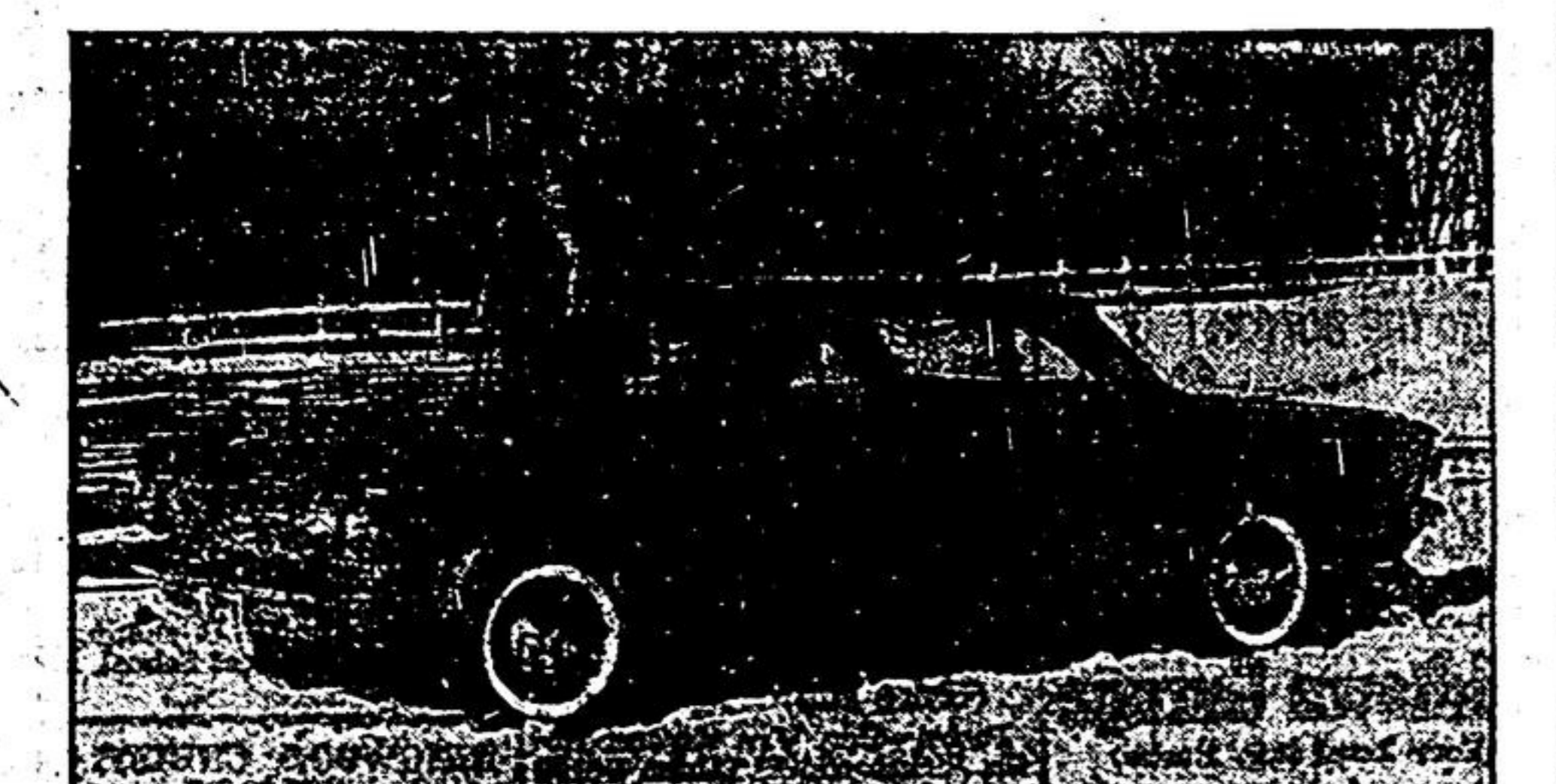

1960 CORVAIR COUPE

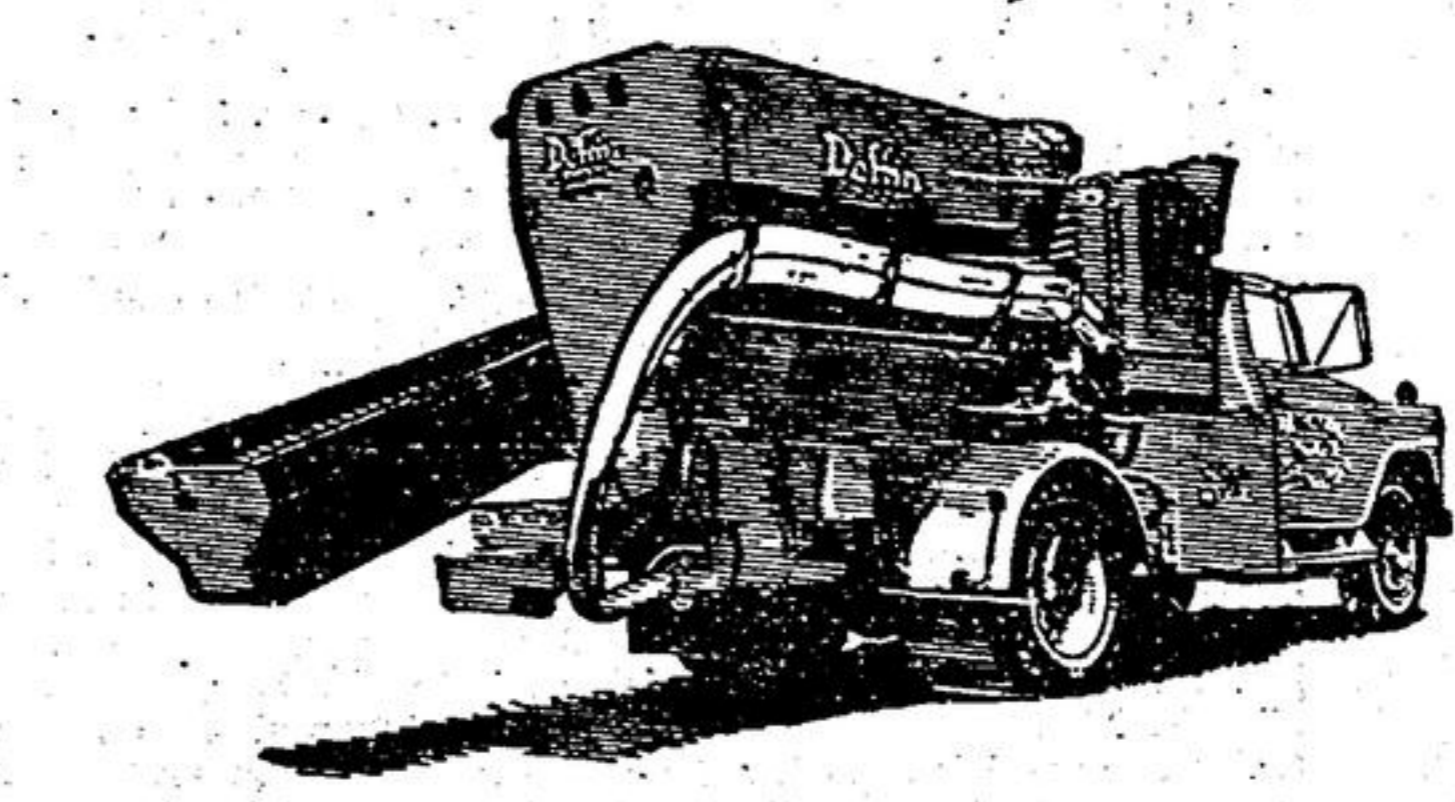
