NO OBSTRUCTION AT BAY.

DEVELOPER ASSURES

Water currents in Lake Ontario were studied and tracked to assure developers of BAY RIDGES that none of the sewage effluent from Bay Ridges would contaminate Frenchman's Bay.

The new community, which will accommodate 12,000 persons when it is completed two years from now, is on the shores of Lake Ontario just three miles east of the borders of Metro Toronto.

The developers, Consolidated Building Corporation, largest builders of low cost homes in Canada, are also constructing

the sewage disposal plant which, on completion, will be given to Pickering township.

The sewage outlet for the plant extends at least 2,000 feet into Lake Ontario from the shores outside of the bay itself. It is one-half mile from the gap which gives an entrance to the bay itself.

The water current flow in that area assures that effluent will be at least two miles from the bay entrance as it sweeps on a westward course away from shore.

There is no likelihood at all, even during inclement weather, that the effluent could enter the gap and contaminate or pollute the bay waters around which the new development will be built, assures Ralph Zeldin, an officer of the development corporation.

The new water system, which is also being constructed by the development company, will also be given to Pickering township when it is completed.

The intake pipes for the water system are one and a half miles east of the sewage plant. Their location so far east and the present knowledge that the currents are westerly ensures the purity of the water entering the filtration system at the water plant, Mr. Zeldin asserts.
