## Present Hospital Needs

York County Council is to study a brief this week presented by York County Hospital Board and York Central Hospital Association last week.

The report calls for the expenditure of \$8,700,000 within the next three years to satisfy the hospital needs of the county.

Presented by the association Chairman, D. H. Storms, the report recommended that Newmarket's hospital be expanded from the present 113 beds to 380 beds at an earlier reported estimated cost of \$4,500,000.

Also recommended was a new 200-bed hospital for Richmond Hill at a cost of \$4,200,000.

Overall federal and provincial grants for the county would be an estimated \$2,500,000.
