

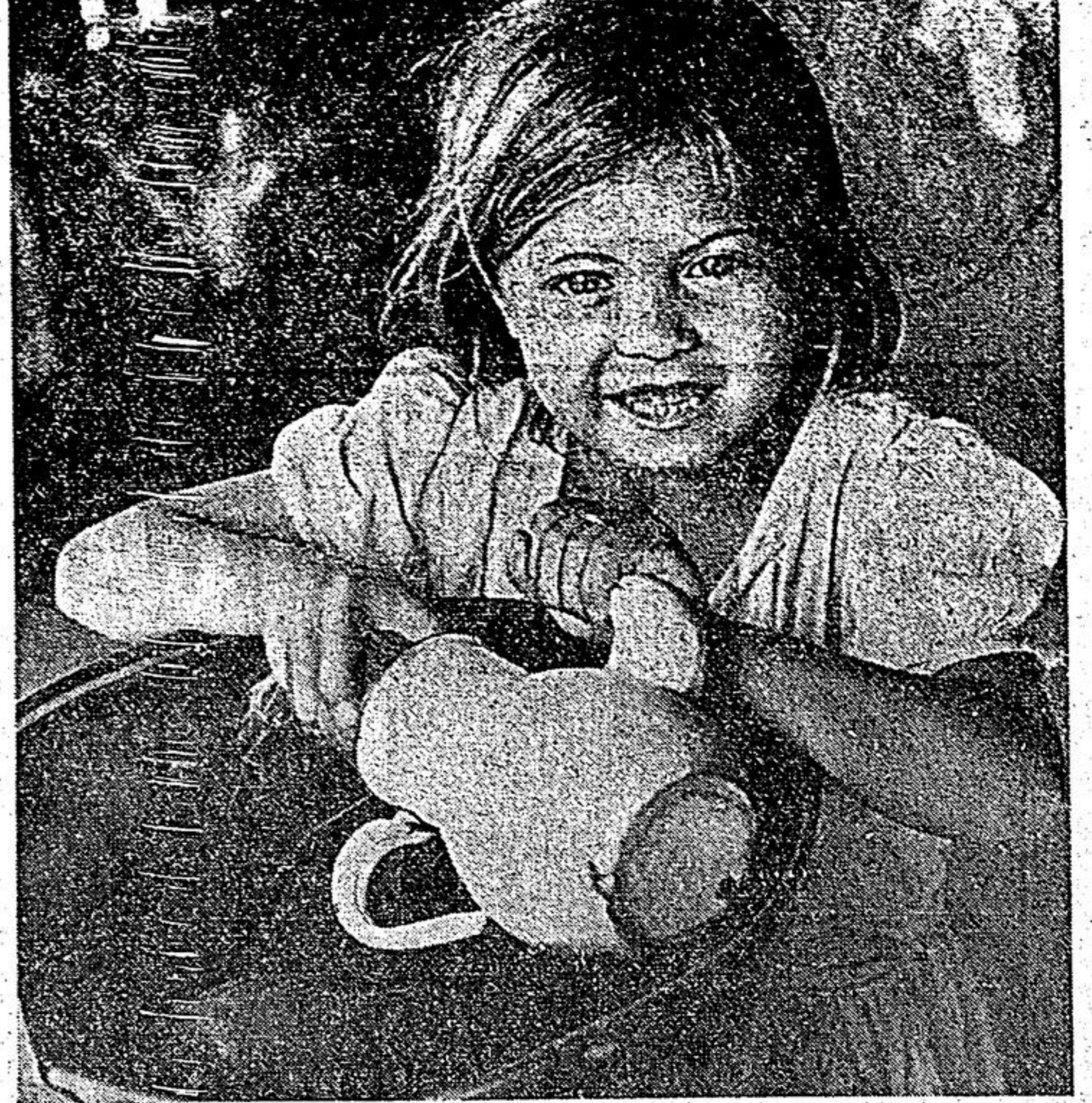

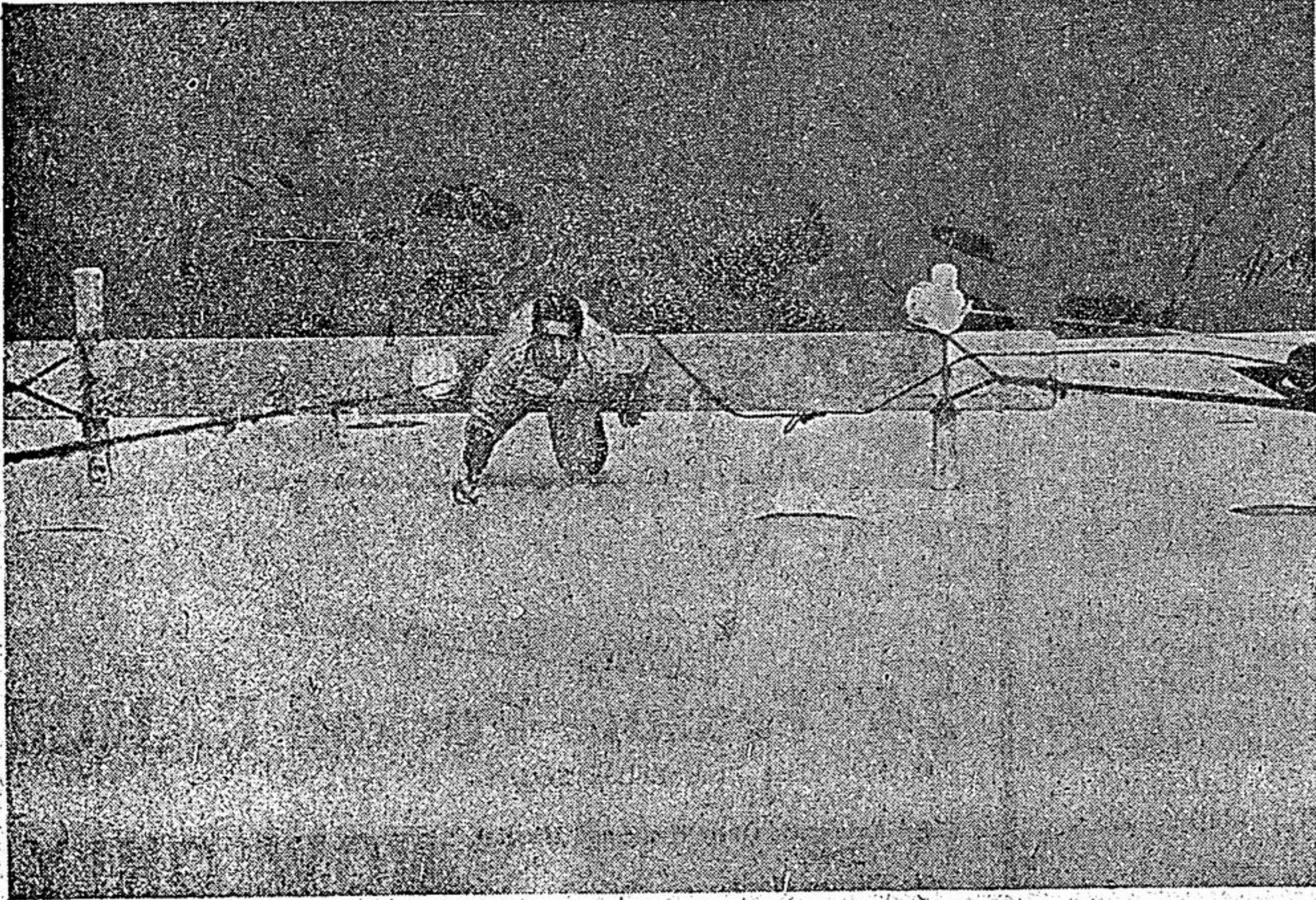

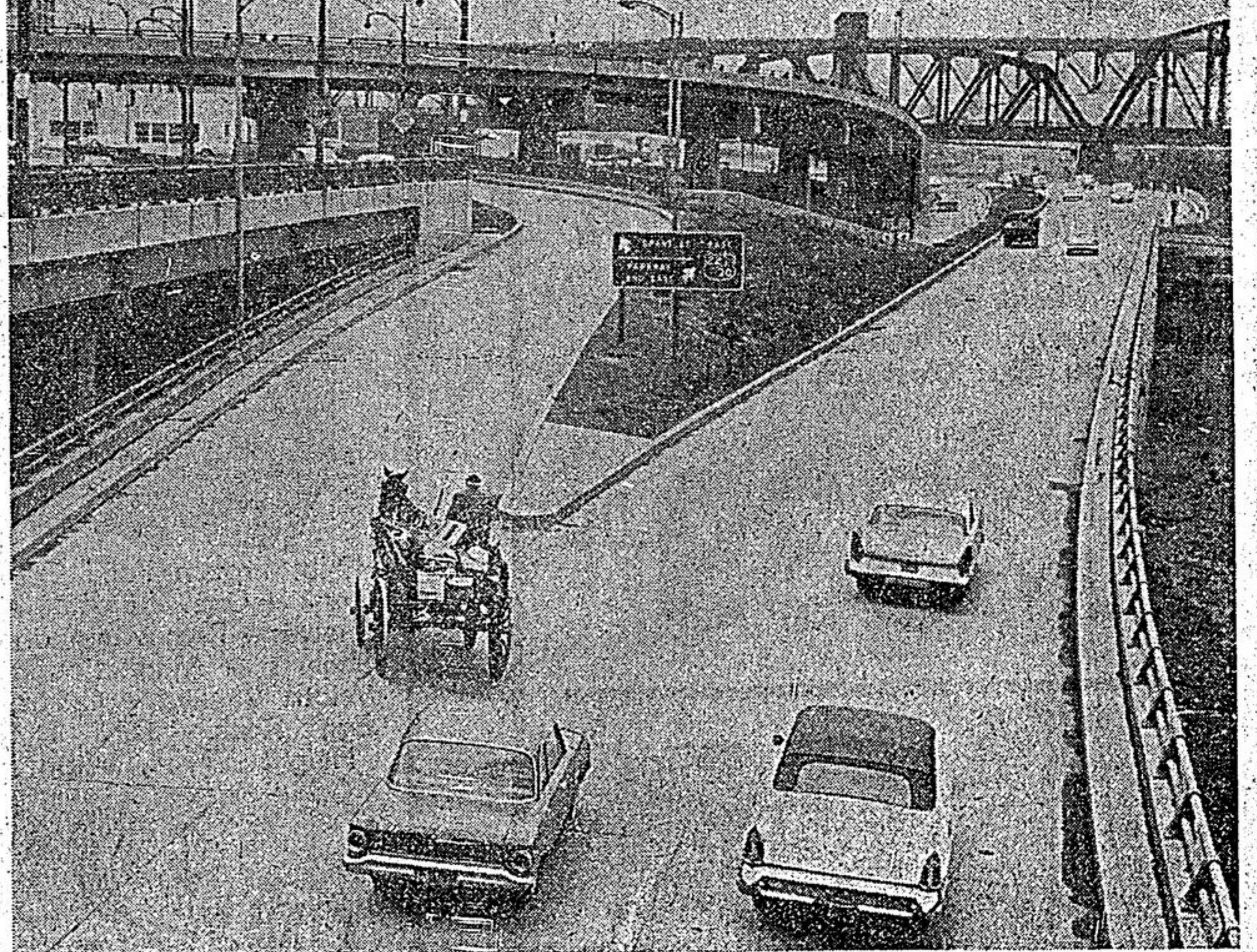

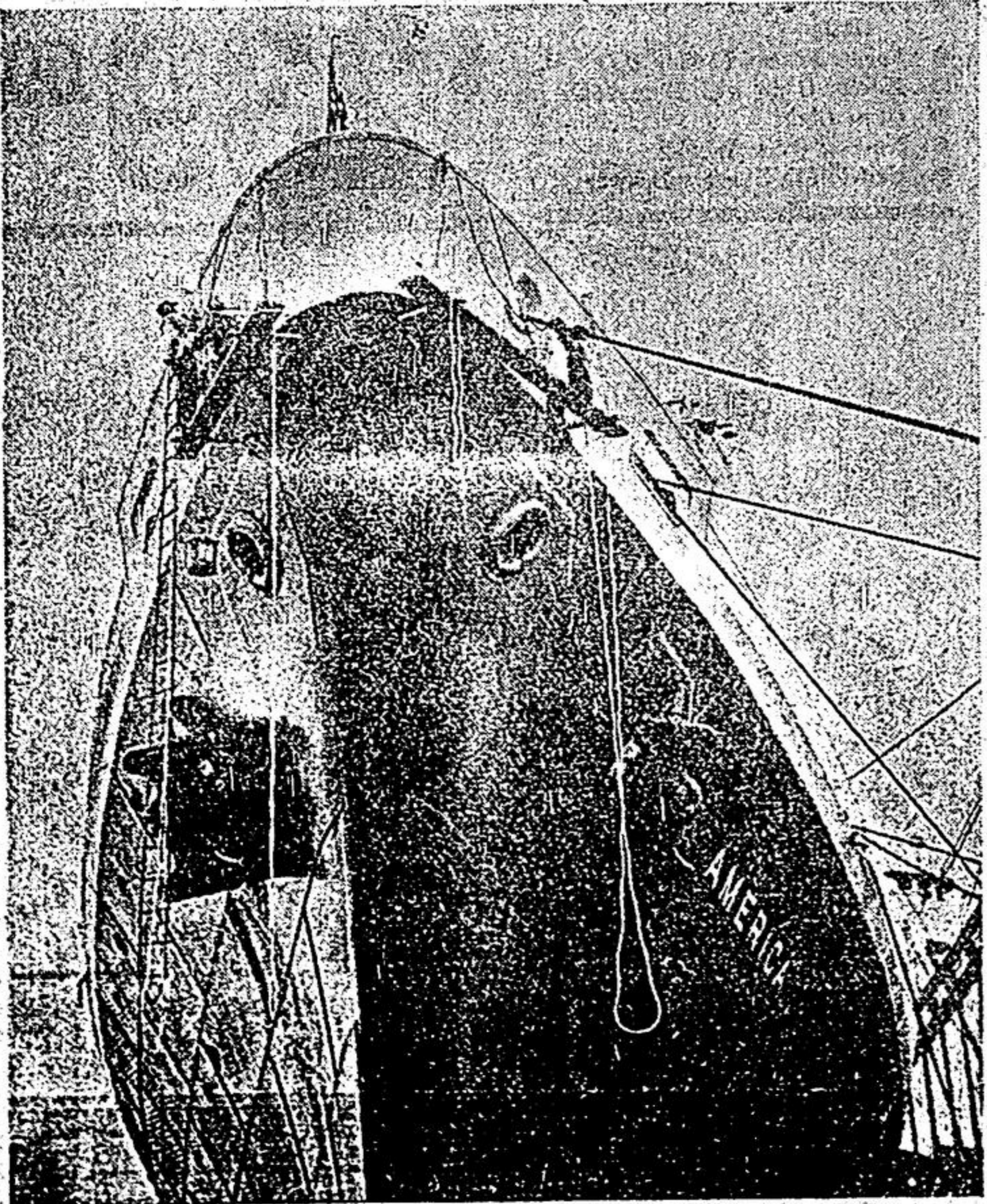

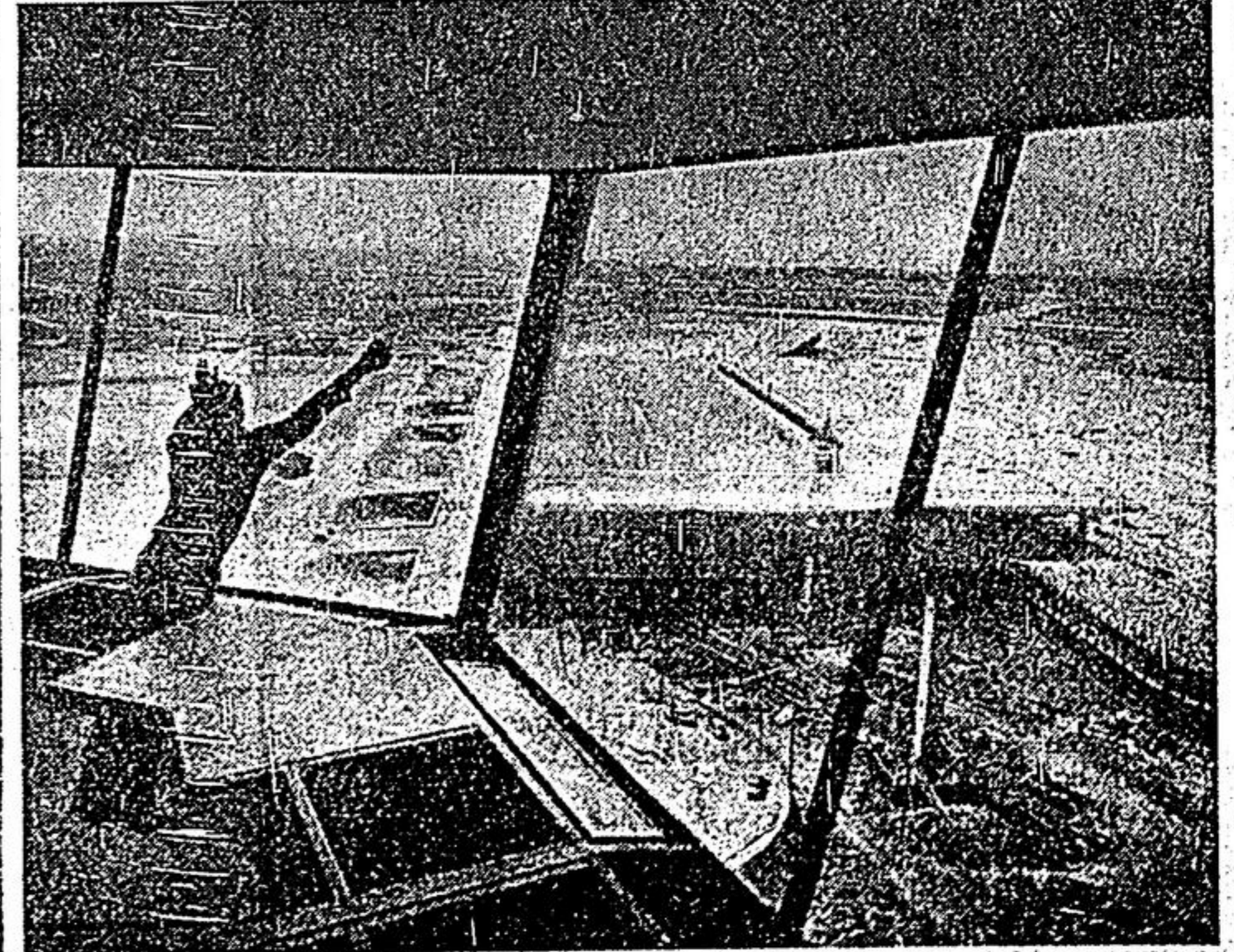

## TOMORROW'S AIRPORT

AT FIUMINCINO, ITALY, visitors may see what the airport of tomorrow will look like.
