Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Pegg and family spent the weekend at her father's cottage at Bala.

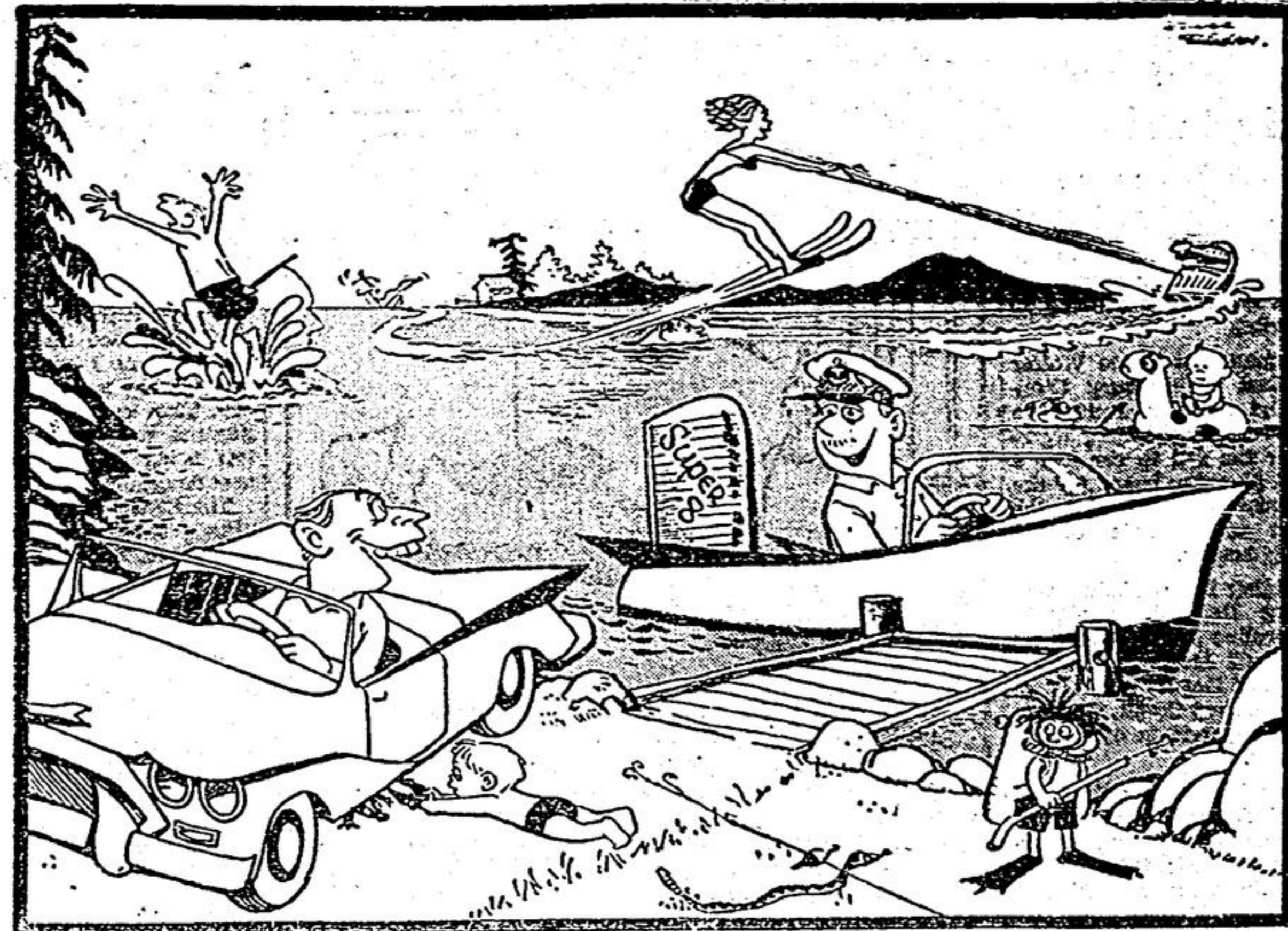
