## United Church Membership Up 40% Since '40

The Nineteenth General Council of The United Church of Canada will be asked to take a "cold, hard look" at the fundamental principles underlying the United Church's program, examine what other churches are doing in long-range planning, survey the capital needs of the church and discover ways of enlisting closer participation of congregations in the total mission of the church.

A long range planning committee was set up by the 18th General Council (which met in Ottawa) two years ago. In its preliminary survey of church statistics it discovered that while the nation's population had increased 51.24 per cent. in the past 20 years, the church had shown a gain in membership of only 39.78 per cent. While the United Church could look forward to a possible membership of 1,141,149 by 1965, and 1,246,344 by 1970, death and retirement were creating an annual loss of 91 ministers; and while the church could expect to gain 20 new ministers a year in the next five years, actually 40 new ministers a year would be needed.

## Lawn Mowers Worse Than Jet Planes

Two Oshawa housewives told Magistrate F. S. Ebbs last week the noise coming from power lawnmowers in their area was worse than "jet planes" and "like shots fired over your head."

They were testifying on a charge of making unnecessary noise laid against lawnmower repairman Oliver Olan, 81 Central Park boulevard south.

After listening to the angry testimony of Mrs. Helen Coppin and Mrs. Eleanor Train, neighbors of Mr. Olan, Magistrate Ebbs adjourned the hearing to Sept. 21, telling the court he had heard "enough noise for this morning."

The first witness, Mrs. Coppin, testified the noise coming from a lawnmower, being repaired by Mr. Olan, was so bad that it was unbearable. "I just want a little civilization around here in a R-1 district," she said.

On the day in question, she said, Mr. Olan's wife started to mow her own lawn "to cover up."

In a spirited verbal duel with defence counsel, Russell Humphreys, she invited the lawyer to come down and mow her lawn with a hand mower because she didn't like the noise of any power mower. He replied he might come if he had a pair of ear muffs. She admitted the business had been established before the anti-noise bylaw was passed.

Mrs. Train said the noise was so bad "it would almost make one sick." She said that the accused was always testing machines and bothering her.

When asked by R. D. Humphreys, Q.C. defence counsel, to give the specific times she heard the noise on the day in question she replied she didn't "have all day to watch the clock and Mr. Olan."
