Loss of Mr. David Greer Saddens Community

Mr. David Greer of Lemonville passed away at the York County Hospital, Newmarket, on Thursday, Sept. 15. Although the deceased had been in failing health for some time, his passing came as a shock to his many friends and neighbours. He leaves to mourn his wife and two children, Walter and JoAnne. Walter is in the army and stationed at Camp Shilo in Manitoba while JoAnne is at home and attends the local High School. Mr. Greer's mother and sister Florence of Brantford, also Dorothy of Colorado, mourn his passing. Rev. Arthur Greer, a brother and pastor in Pueblo, Colorado, was home during the last weeks of Mr. Greer's illness. The Greers came from Ireland some years ago and David, during recent years, had been employed as an inspector at De Havilland. He was a lay preacher for many years, a most faithful member of the 2nd Markham Baptist Church and superintendent of the Sunday School. He always took a keen interest in the Stouffville and District Christian Men's Fellowship and was a past president of that organization. The funeral service was held on Sunday afternoon in the 2nd Markham Church and with burial in the adjoining cemetery. The service was conducted by the pastor, Rev. Bruce Hisey assisted by the Ontario Superintendent of the Canadian Sunday School Mission, Rev. F. Kriek. Mrs. Mary Hutchinson sang the beautiful hymn, "And Can It Be that I should Gain," which is the theme hymn of the Men's Fellowship and the one especially requested to be sung at his funeral only a few days before his passing. Pallbearers were—Harry Clendenning, Harry Dulmage, Jack Clubine, Maurice Farquharson, Lorie Winburn and Charles Ratcliff. The community keenly feels the loss of a good friend and Christian brother.

Disorderly Conduct Brings \$120 Court Fine to Youth

Charges of disorderly conduct and drinking while under age brought a heavy fine against a Markham district youth in Newmarket Court last week. Dean Middleton, 17, of R.R. 2, Markham, was fined \$120 and costs by Magistrate O. S. Hollinrake. In addition, he was ordered to post a \$500 bond to keep the peace for one year. Middleton was arrested by Constables Wm. Gunn and Darrell Dewar on Sept. 5th on a parking lot at the intersection of No. 7 and No. 48 Hwys. According to the evidence, the defendant was using obscene language. He later broke a bottle on the pavement and scattered the glass on the highway. A charge involving this incident will be aired in Traffic Court. The accused was fined \$100 for causing a disturbance in a public place. He was further fined \$20 for drinking while under age.
