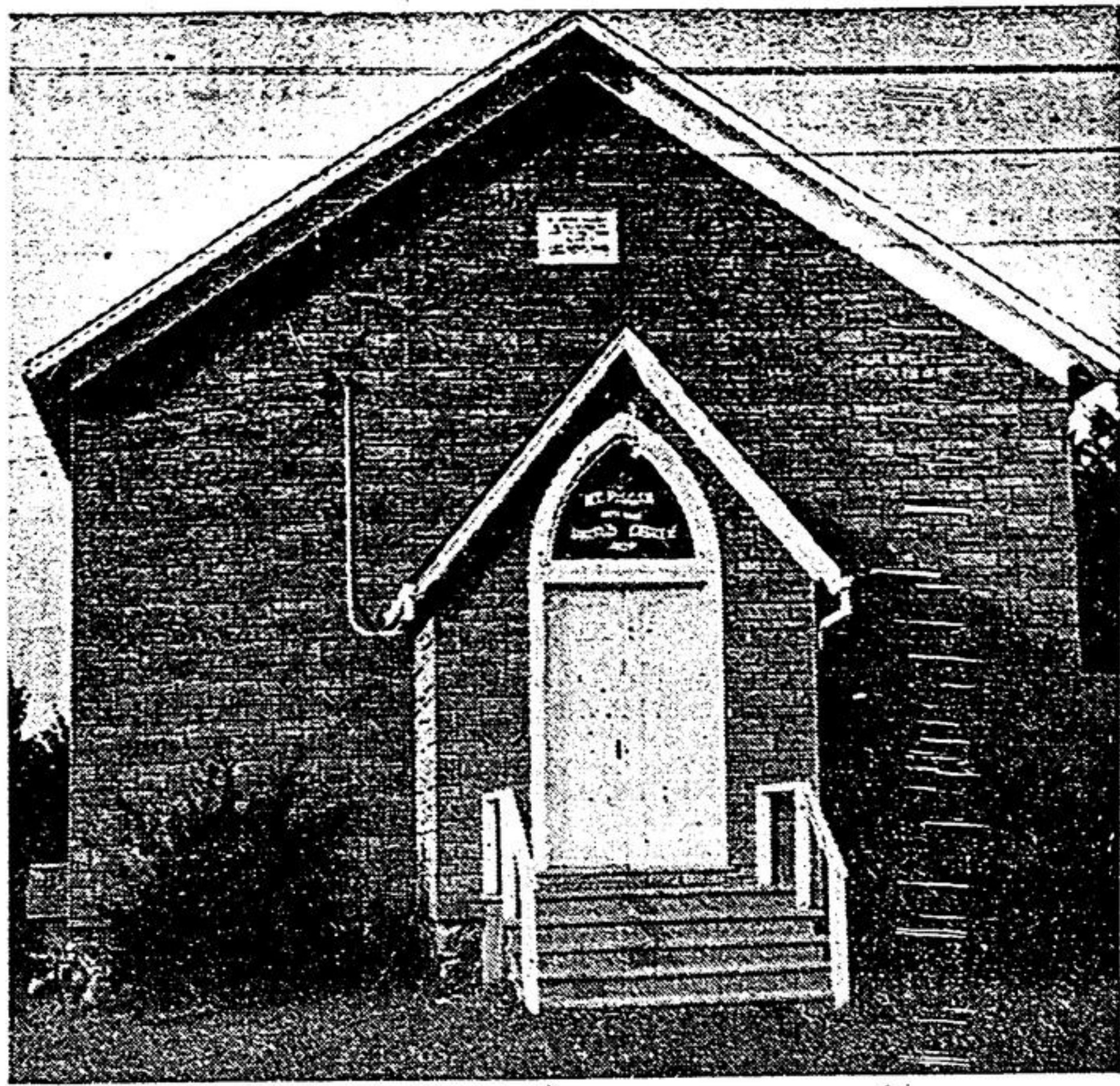

## 1961 Census To Pry Into Family Secrets

Canadians will have their heads counted in a general census starting next June 1. The mammoth survey, 10th decennial census since Confederation, is expected to last two to three weeks in most areas and employ an army of between 25,000 and 27,000 enumerators. Date of the census was announced yesterday by the government. Results of the population count will form the basis of the next redistribution of seats in the House of Commons. Intimate Questions— The census takers will probe a little deeper into the intimate sub-structure of Canadian family life than in former years. For instance, they will want to know something about a mother's fertility, and of the total earnings—not just wages—of the breadwinners. Officials said they could not estimate how much the big project will cost; this had not been figured out yet. They were certain, though, that it would cost much more than the 1951 census, on which the total outlay was \$8,291,000. 15 Basic Questions— The 1951 census placed Canada's population at 14,009,429. By 1956, when the pocket-size quinquennial census was carried out, this had risen to 16,080,791. The basic questionnaire will contain 15 questions. In addition, those 25 or over will be asked 10 more questions, mostly having to do with their work and income. For males 25 and over, there will be still another query, on wartime service in the armed forces. At every fifth household married, widowed or divorced women will be asked when they were married and how many live-born children they have had. This "fertility question" was tried out in a dry run last year at Joliette, Que., and Galt, and housewives showed little reluctance to answer it. Radios Old Hat— There will be a household questionnaire for every fifth non-farm home. This reflects the changing social conditions and rising standards of living in Canada. For instance, instead of asking whether the subject has a radio—which just about everybody now has—the enumerator will ask whether he has a TV set.

If you don't want your cider to turn to vinegar, preserve it in clean barrels, vats or glass jugs. Add 1 1/2 ounces of sodium benzoate for every 10 gallons of cider, or pasteurize it in bottles in a water bath, kept at 175° F. for 20 minutes. Cool the bottles immediately.
