### C.A.R.S. Establishes Treatment Centre In Richmond Hill

The Ontario Division of the Canadian Arthritis and Rheumatism Society has arranged with the Richmond Hill Public Library Board for a physiotherapy Treatment Centre to be operated in the Public Library auditorium Tuesday afternoons from 1 to 4 p.m. Mrs. K. M. Marsden, a highly qualified physiotherapist, who is well known in this area for her services to arthritis sufferers, will be in charge of this Centre.

The opening of the new centre is due to the increasing demand for the services of the Society and was influenced, in some measure, by the results of the recent registration survey conducted through the co-operation of the Ontario Pharmacists' Association. Over 360 from this area filled our registration cards indicating that they were sufferers from arthritis or the rheumatic diseases. With this new treatment centre in operation C.A.R.S. is able to increase the number of patients treated by extending its services to all sufferers able to obtain transportation to the centre. Patients may come from anywhere in York County or beyond. This includes Newmarket, Aurora, Maple, Markham, Stouffville, Woodbridge, Schomberg, Bradford, and other communities.

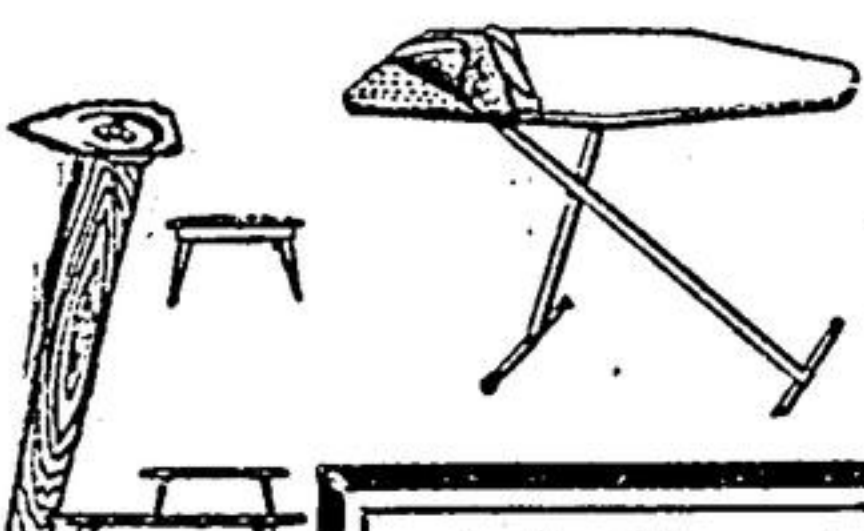

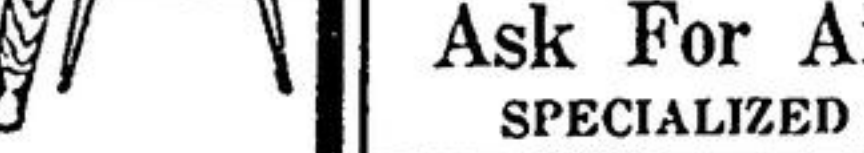

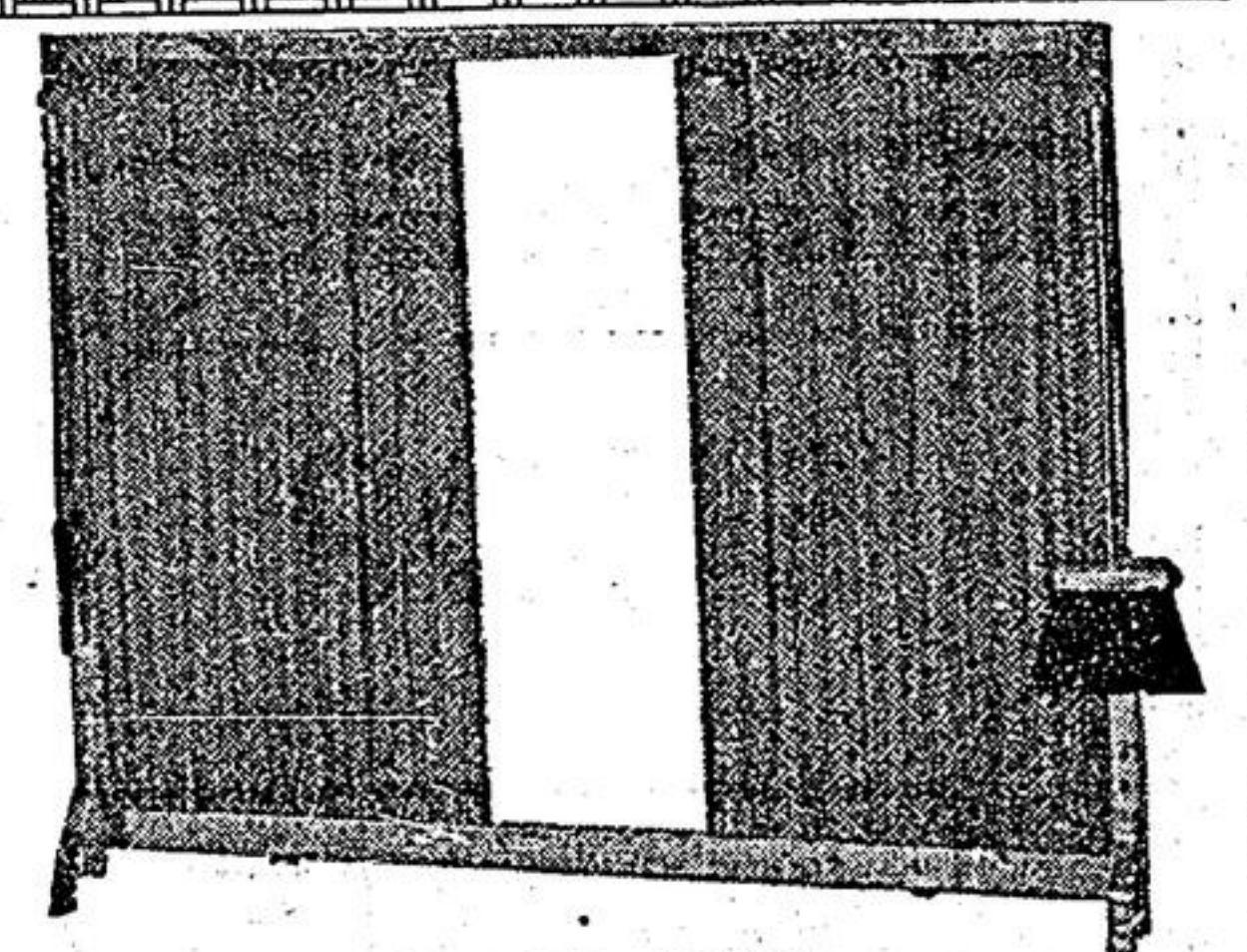
