**N. E. Sitwell Conservation Officer 22 Years**

wheat from the dealers. Disposal of this wheat is financed by the nine cent levy and each year, the unused portion of the levy collected is returned to the producers who marketed wheat.

Last year the board made a five cent per bushel payment, the balance or four cents a bushel was absorbed in the cost of marketing three and one half million bushels of surplus wheat.

**Announce Payment For Wheat Sales**

Ontario wheat producers will share a total of \$560,574 for Ontario wheat marketed from July 1, 1959 to June 30, 1960. York County's share amounts to \$38,309. Nearly 426,000 bushels were marketed by 1094 growers. This amount is equivalent to the nine cent levy collected. Individual producer payments are now being distributed. In announcing the payment, the Ontario Wheat Producers' Marketing Board said the amount will be shared by approximately 24,000 producers. Slightly more than six million bushels of the 1959 wheat crop was marketed. Under the Ontario Wheat Producers' Marketing Plan, a nine cent levy is collected by the board through the dealers on delivery as a price stabilizing measure. Should producer sales to dealers become greater than the market demand, the dealers may offer the excess amount to the board. The board is then obligated to purchase the surplus

**Phones for Farm at Fair**

Visitors to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair at Toronto will see the latest type of communication system designed for the farm family, displayed at a Bell Telephone exhibit. Called "Farm Interphone" the system combines the house telephone with a wide range of intercommunication features through the use of loudspeaker microphones.

A farmer plowing or haying, for example, could use Farm Interphone to communicate with the house. Another could have two-way conversation with his wife in the kitchen without leaving the orchard. The applications of this system are seemingly endless. Bell Telephone points out, and many have been tested in field trials. Although Farm Interphone is not yet available in Canada, it will probably be on the market sometime in 1961.

The basic Farm Interphone system consists of a master telephone in the house, an extension phone in the barn or other outbuilding and one or more two-way loudspeakers located around the farm. Each telephone is equipped with a special loudspeaker - microphone and a button which enables the phone to be used for intercom calls or regular phone calls. Telephones and loudspeakers can be added to suit individual requirements.

This system will enable the farmer to keep in touch with outside contacts from his barn-

yard, outbuildings or fields. For example, a call on the main telephone can be taken by his wife from a caller who needs information from the farmer. She can hold the call at the touch of a button, and by turning another switch, use the intercom and loudspeaker system to call him. Her voice is carried over the farm wherever a Farm Interphone is located - barn, dairy, poultry house or shop - and to the outside work areas - barnyard, orchard or field. The farmer can answer without even touching the communication system or stopping work. As the loudspeaker-microphone can be kept on continuously - adjusted to any desired volume

-the system can provide 24-hour-a-day monitoring service. The sound of a sick animal, a fox in the chicken house, children at play, malfunctioning of running machinery and many other tell-tale sounds can be picked up and transmitted over the system for the benefit of the farmer and his family.

A special ringer is mounted near the main telephone. It is connected to the line and will cause the transistorized control unit to transmit a tone ringing signal over the loudspeakers, so that the ringing can be heard outdoors. This ringer is equipped with volume control and shut-off device.
