BY-LAW NO. 60-13 REFERRED TO IN THE ABOVE NOTICE.

### THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF STOUFFVILLE BY-LAW NUMBER 60-13

Being a By-Law to amend By-Law number 861 as amended by by-law number 868.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the Village of Stouffville that By-Law number 861 as amended by By-Law number 868 of the Village of Stouffville be and the same is hereby further amended as follows:

- By striking out from the said By-Law 868 Schedule "A" attached thereto and by substituting therefor, Schedule "A" attached hereto.
  - Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law number 861 as amended the minimum frontage for a one family dwelling on lots 39 and 40 according to registered plan number 70 shall be 50 feet.
  - Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law number 861 as amended the minimum frontage for a one family dwelling on Block A, registered plan 401 shall be 55 feet.
  - Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law 861 as amended the minimum frontage for a one family dwelling on the Northernly 5 feet of lot 8 and the Southernly 47 feet of lot 7 according to registered plan number 3268 shall be 52 feet.
- This By-law shall come into effect on the day in which it is passed by Council subject to the approval of The Ontario Municipal Board.
