Up Borrowing Bylaw
Council passed the annual bylaw authorizing the borrowing, if necessary, of up to \$300,000, to operate the municipality until tax time. This amount is up some \$50,000 over last year's bylaw, but is still well below the permitted 70% of estimated revenues which run over \$600,000.
