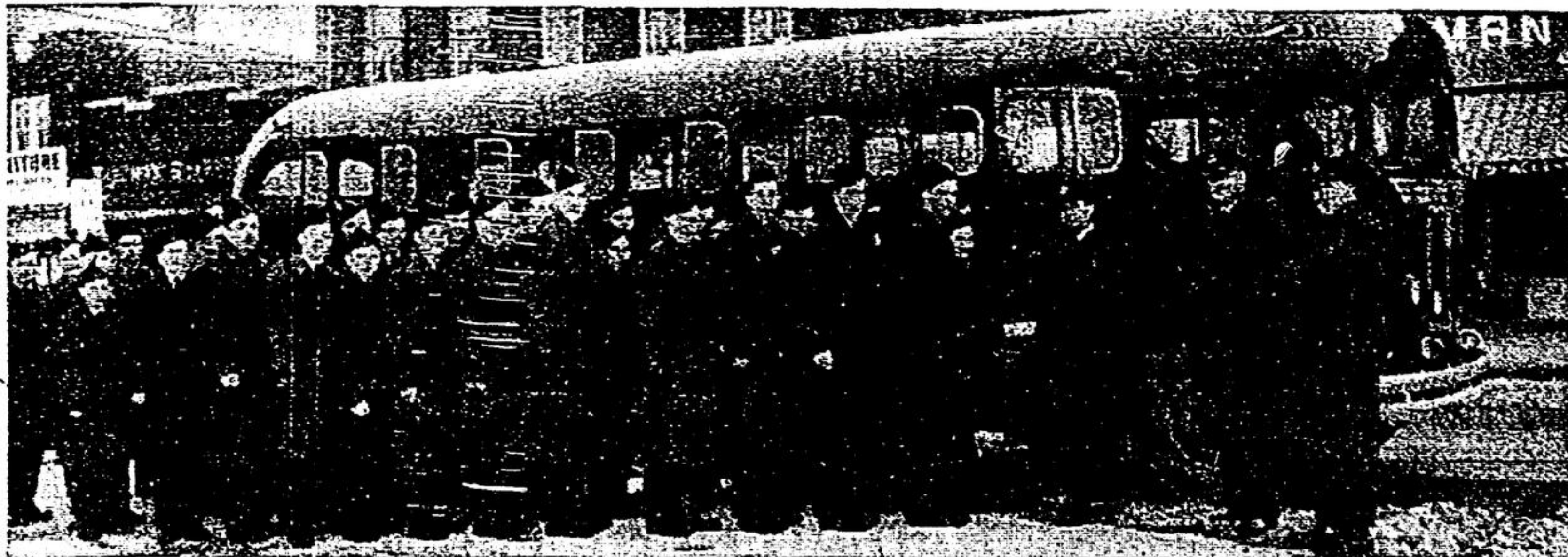


Air Cadets Board Bus for Visit to RCAF Station

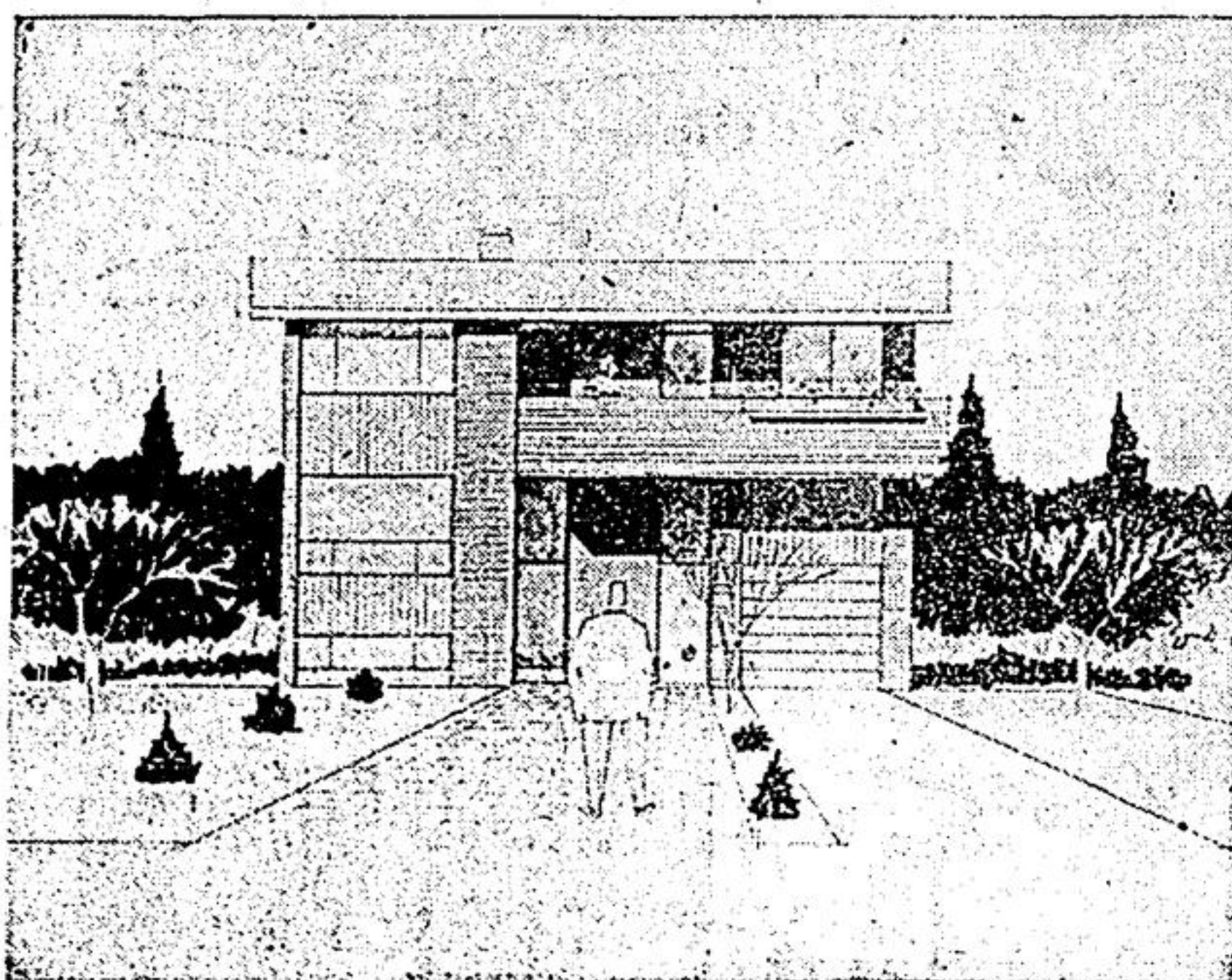
