**Request for Big Plowing Match Being Studied**

A delegation led by York County Warden Jos. Fry and made up of members of the Agricultural Committee, representatives of the local Plowmen's Associations and the Agricultural Representative, has presented a request at the annual meeting of the Ontario Plowmen's Association that York County be considered as the location for the International Plowing Match in 1965. This proposal is being studied further at the present time by each of the Plowmen's Associations in the County and by the Directors of the O.P.A. A further meeting of all those in the County interested, is scheduled for June and a final decision on our invitation will be made at that time.

There is a keen interest in match plowing in York County. Last year, three local Matches drew 143 entries, \$2,516.00 was paid in prize money and the estimated attendance was 1425. It is believed there are several suitable locations for an International Match in York.
