TIME TO FREEZE CORN

Now is the time for fresh garden corn. It's equally good on the cob or off the cob, and if properly treated, will freeze well

Here are the two points that Professor E. W. Franklin, refrigeration specialist at the Ontario Agricultural College, considers most important for high quality frozen coin.

First the corn must be at the proper stage of maturity. This means the ears should have tender, milky kernels. Immature ears have undersized kernels and a watery milk. Overmature ears have relatively tough kernels with thick milk that does not spurt out when the kernel is split open with the thumb

The second point is that freshness is essential. You should pick the corn and have it in the freezer within 3 hours.

All vegetables require blanching before freezing, to preserve their natural colour and flavour. If the vegetables are not blanched, the enzymes present cause deterioration and the frozen vegetables may have an unpleasant taste.
