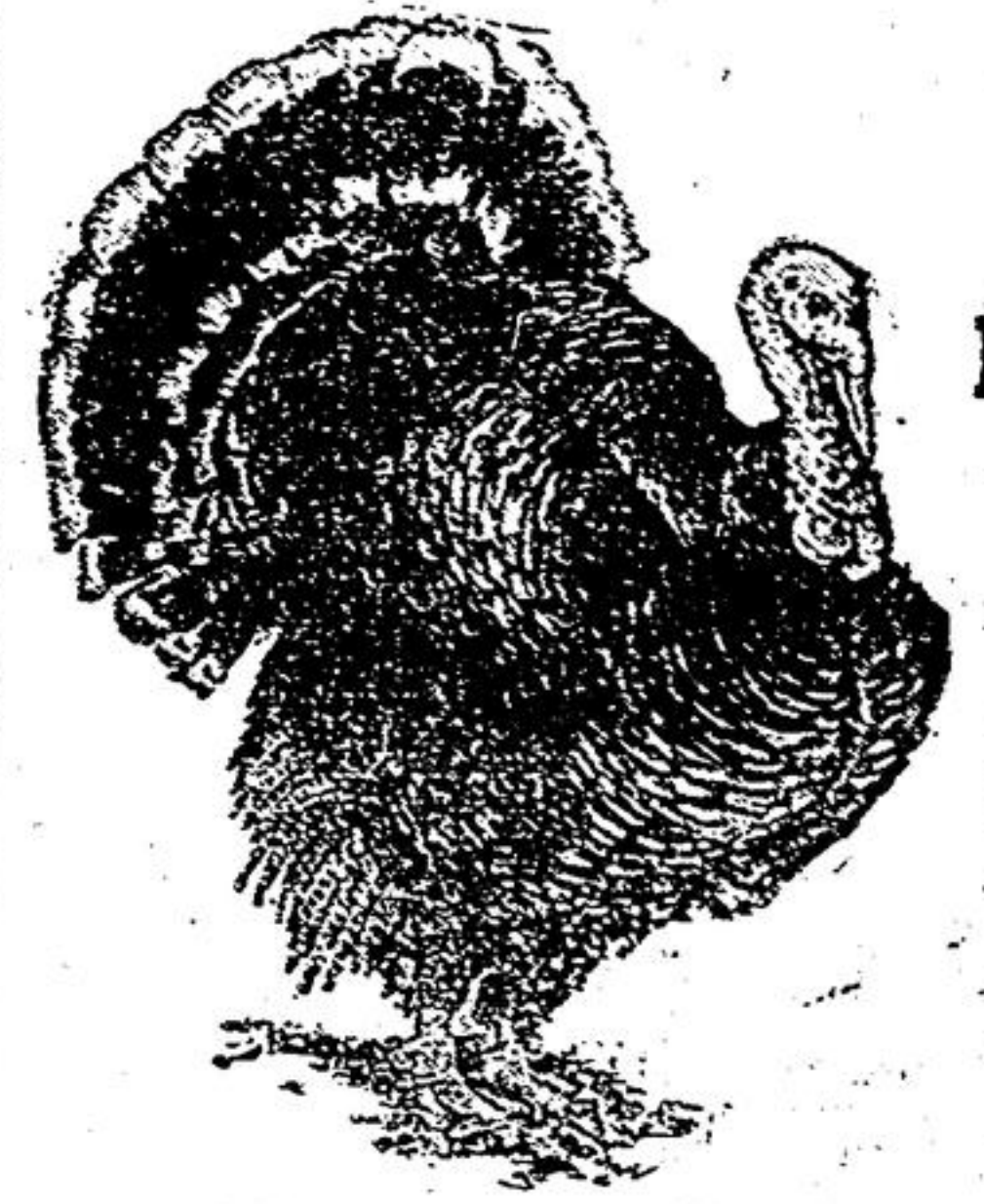
**FOLLIOTT**

late Robert and Jane Ashenhurst and was born in the Twp. of Uxbridge. As a member of the Clarendon United Church, she took an active part in the church organizations.

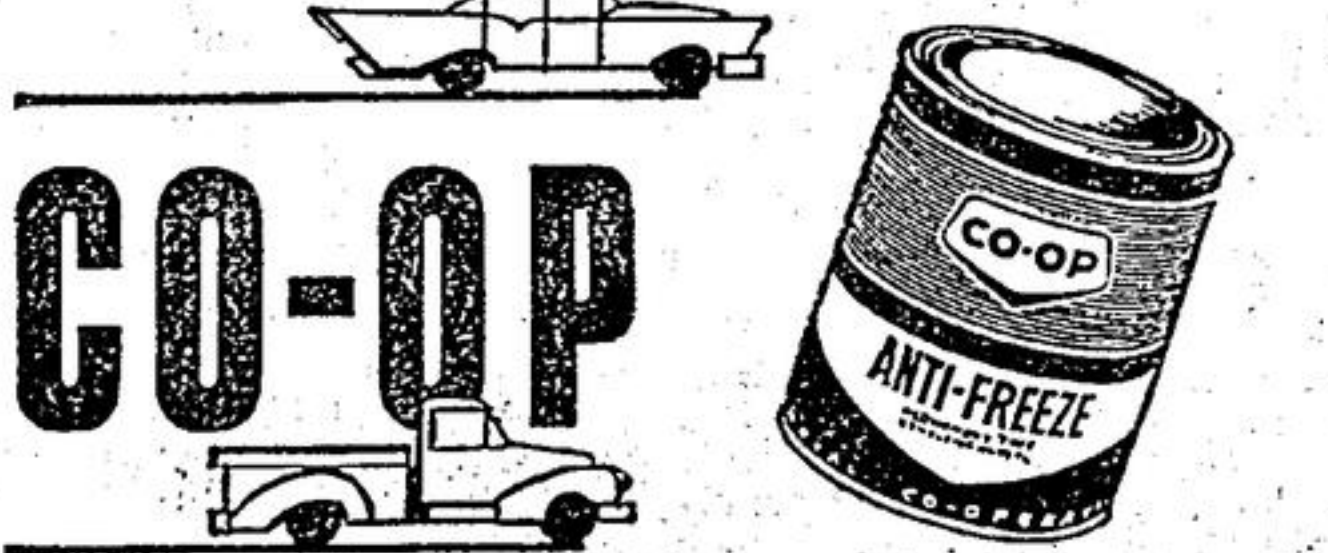
