A Letter From Your Doctor and Dentist

It is not so many years since the dreaded disease, smallpox, brought death or disfigurement to thousands. Since the advent of vaccination, smallpox has been virtually eliminated. Chlorination has practically eliminated typhoid fever, pasteurization of milk has made bovine tuberculosis a disease of the past, toxoid has wiped out diphtheria, the addition of iodine to salt prevents goiter. We now have at hand a measure to attack the problem of dental decay. Fluoridation of water supplies is one of the truly great public health procedures of our time. This fact has been recognized by a commission appointed by the Ontario Government which spent over 2 years studying the subject as well as by your own municipal council.
We expected that this medical advance would be welcomed by the general public as had other great discoveries. The evidence regarding the benefits and safety of fluoridation has won scientific acceptance everywhere but in the public mind. Public confidence has been undermined by the irresponsible spreading of distortions of facts which create doubt and instill fear by appealing to emotions rather than reason. We ask that you do not allow these misguided activities to deprive future generations of children of the benefits of this new advance in preventive medicine.
We, the undersigned doctors and dentists of Stouffville, wholeheartedly believe in the benefits and safety of the fluoridation of our water supply. We would ask you to go to the polls on election day, December 4th, and vote 'YES' to the question "Are you in favour of the fluoridation of the public water supply."
