



Common Ailments Of House Plants

Probably the most common ailment of house plants is falling leaves. Fuchsia and gardenia are specially prone to this ail-

Ont. Dept. of Agriculture horticulturists caution that leaf troubles such as wilting, yellowing, and curling, may be caused by a host of situations. The main causes, they say, are excessive watering, chilling, chemicals, and inadequate light.

Many people do not realize

that plant roots must have some

air. If you are keeping the soil too wet, it becomes poorly aerated, or water-logged. This will cause the roots to rot and the leaves to fade and wilt. To avoid this, water less often, and check to see if there is good drainage from the bottom of the pot. Many plants, especially tropiral varieties, may suffer if exposed to an open window. A few
