president of the Ladies' Aid. Mrs. Frank Puckrin, read & summary of the W.A. since its beginning. The first Ladies' Aid of Audley Methodist Church was organized in September, 1908, by the Rev. J. C. Bell. This society, of which Mrs. James Fowlie was the first president had a membership fee of ten cents, and a monthly fee of five cents. It was disbanded in October, 1919. After a lapse of nine years, the present organization was organized on January 18, 1928, by the Rev. A. R. Sanderson, minister of Audley United Church. Mrs. Frank Puckrin was the first president of this society. Of the eleven presidents since 1928, all are living in Audley and active in the W.A. except Mrs. E. Pardon, Oshawa, and Mrs. Walter Pratt, Galt. Four of the charter members, Mrs. Frank Puckrin, Mrs. W. H. Guthrie, Mrs. Lorne Saunders and Mrs. Charlie Clemence are still living in Audley. Mrs. W. II. Guthrie, who served as president for eleven years, has a life membership pin for her long years of service.

During the past 33 years the ladies have taken an active part in the church life of the community, arranging social activities from sock socials and dramas to family suppers, programs and banquets. They have supplied the church with such things as lamp glasses, stove pipes, matches, kitchen supplies, chairs, lawn mower, cur tains, pianos, hymn books, Bibles, and dishes. They have paid the piano-tuners, the caretakers, the hydro bills and the clock-repair bills. The ladies contributed nearly \$600 worth of equipment for the new church which was built in 1956. The W.A. has sent many contributions of money, quilts, Blankets, bales of clothing, food parcels, bandages, fruit, flowers, Christmas boxes, cards etc. Methods used to raise funds have ranged from sunshine bags, mite boxes. magazines to the modern bazaars and teas. And now the present W.A., which became af filiated with the H.M.S. in 1914, will fade into the past on Dec. 31, to emerge as The United Church Women of the United Church of Canada in January.
