Flood Control Program To Start This Year

A start on actual construction of the first stage of the \$39 million flood control and water conservation scheme for Metro Toronto and region is expected to take place early this year, the executive committee of the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority was told last week. Stouffville contributes \$1,000 a year for ten years to this program.

The plan is being financed by the federal and Ontario governments and the Conservation Authority, and embraces construction of 15 dams and reservoirs, acquisition of 7600 acres of flood plain land, and channel improvements on regional streams.

A progress report on the plan was submitted to the executive today. It noted that:

- preliminary engineering studies and surveys are underway for the York Mills channelization of the Don river as well as for reservoirs on the Don watershed;
- final engineering is complete for the \$300,000 Woodbridge channelization project;
- final engineering is in progress for the top-priority Claireville dam and reservoir located on the west branch of the Humber, about 5 miles west of Woodbridge. This dam is to be constructed during 1962-63 at a cost of \$1,452,000;
- acquisition of majority of sites for the Milne reservoir at Markham, with preliminary engineering agreement being negotiated.

— preliminary engineering studies of reservoir sites on Duffin Creek is in progress;

— an agreement is being drafted for preliminary engineering for reservoirs to be located on the east and west branches of the Humber;

— final design of the remaining sections of the \$4,000,000 Black Creek channel improvement project in northwest Metro Toronto is now in progress, and the Wilson Ave. to Rustic Ave. section is expected to be completed by March 1.

The Ontario government has given its approval to preliminary property plans concerning the Eglinton Flats, lower Rouge valley, lower Duffin Creek as well as lands in the Don valley and Highland creek areas.

Total land acquisition to date for the flood control scheme amounts to 798 acres.

The executive today approved plans to extend the Authority's flood warning system, by setting up stream gauging systems for the Don river at Don Mills Rd., the Humber river at Bolton, the Humber river at Woodbridge, and Duffin Creek at the 4th Concession, Pickering Township.

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

(Lesson for January 28)
REVERENCE FOR GOD'S NAME
Exodus 20:7; Lev. 19:12; Matt. 5:33-37; 6:5-9

GOLDEN TEXT — Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name.—Matt. 6:9

THE LESSON AS A WHOLE

We who live in Canada, and in other democratic countries, pride ourselves on our free speech. We loudly boast that ours is not a controlled press, nor are our people inhibited by fear so that they must speak only in whispers.

But in freely expressing ourselves often we do not hesitate to abusively criticize men who hold office of high responsibility and dignity. Language-wise, we ride roughshod over rank and title, often even referring to such men by their first name, or even nickname. All of this tends to produce disrespect and even contempt.

Michael, the archangel, once had a serious dispute with the Devil. The argument concerned the body of Moses. But even the dignified and exalted archangel dared not bring a railing accusation against his foe, but simply said, "The Lord rebuke thee" (see Jude 9). But does not his attitude often rebuke our intemperate and irreverent language?

The Heart of the Lesson

In the Bible the name stands for the person, and often expresses that person's character. This principle is declared in the words of Abigail concerning her churlish husband, Nabal. "As his name is, so is he." (1 Sam. 25:25). The name Eve, that Adam gave to his wife, means "life giver" (see Gen. 3:20); or that the dying Rachel gave to her son, Benoni, signifies "son of my sorrow" (see Gen. 35:18). Again, Jacob received his name, "heel-catcher," or "supplanter," because an incident that occurred at his birth was deemed as a forecast of his character.

The name of God stands for all that He is. This involves all of His divine attributes, embracing His transcendence, His infinite wisdom, power, glory, righteousness, love, and so forth. It expresses His essential nature. In view of this, the name of the one true and living God demands nothing less than the most genuine reverence on the part of the creature.

Because that name is excellent in all the earth (see Psa. 8:1), it calls for universal honor. Hence to utter it in connection with anything unworthy or false is a most serious offense. To take the Lord's name in vain means more than to use it flippantly. It suggests the linking of it with some ill-considered or lightly uttered vow—an oath that one might never be able to keep.

Therefore, any declaration of intention must be voiced in a spirit of dependence upon the Lord, and the Christian must refrain from all swearing of oaths involving future purposes. As for the past or present, his ver-
