

Uxbridge Midget Rally Halts Locals' Clean-sweep of Minors

Larry Taylor, a Midget marksman with Uxbridge, spiked a Stouffville bid for a clean-sweep of three games in Monday night's portion of Minor Hockey Week in Stouffville. The program will conclude on Thursday evening (tonight) with squirt, pee-wee and bantam house league contests.

The Midgets, coasting along with a 4-1 lead midway through the third were rocked back on their heels when Uxbridge struck for 3 goals in three minutes. Larry Taylor counted two of these and Ron May fired the clincher. The two teams settled for a 4-4 tie. Keith Forman, Ross Brown, Eric Neilson and Allan Meabry were the goal-getters for the home town squad. In the two previous games, the Pee-wee All-Stars thumped Uxbridge 8-1 and the Bantams pulled a surprise 4-1 upset victory over Uxbridge Bantams.

Stouffville 4, Uxbridge 4

Stouffville Midgets enjoyed a wide territorial advantage over Uxbridge throughout most of the game but they appeared to fade badly in the final ten minutes. Bill Ballanger in the

Uxbridge cage had a busy night and completed a number of fine stops. John Willis in the Stouffville net was not over-worked but saved the day in the final minute when he blocked two shots in a row. Ballanger's best effort was on a direct drive from the stick of Francis Haylow while lying flat on the ice. Two Stouffville players were injured. Paul Stover was hurt in the first frame but returned to action after a breather. Ron Castle was hit in the mouth with a stick and required a dental check-up.

Coach Harold Hodgson presented a young trio of Brian Madill, Wayne Chapman and Bob Reed into regular action and the threesome played well. Eric Neilson was skating hard every time out and his line with Bill Corner and Ross Brown completed some nice passing plays.

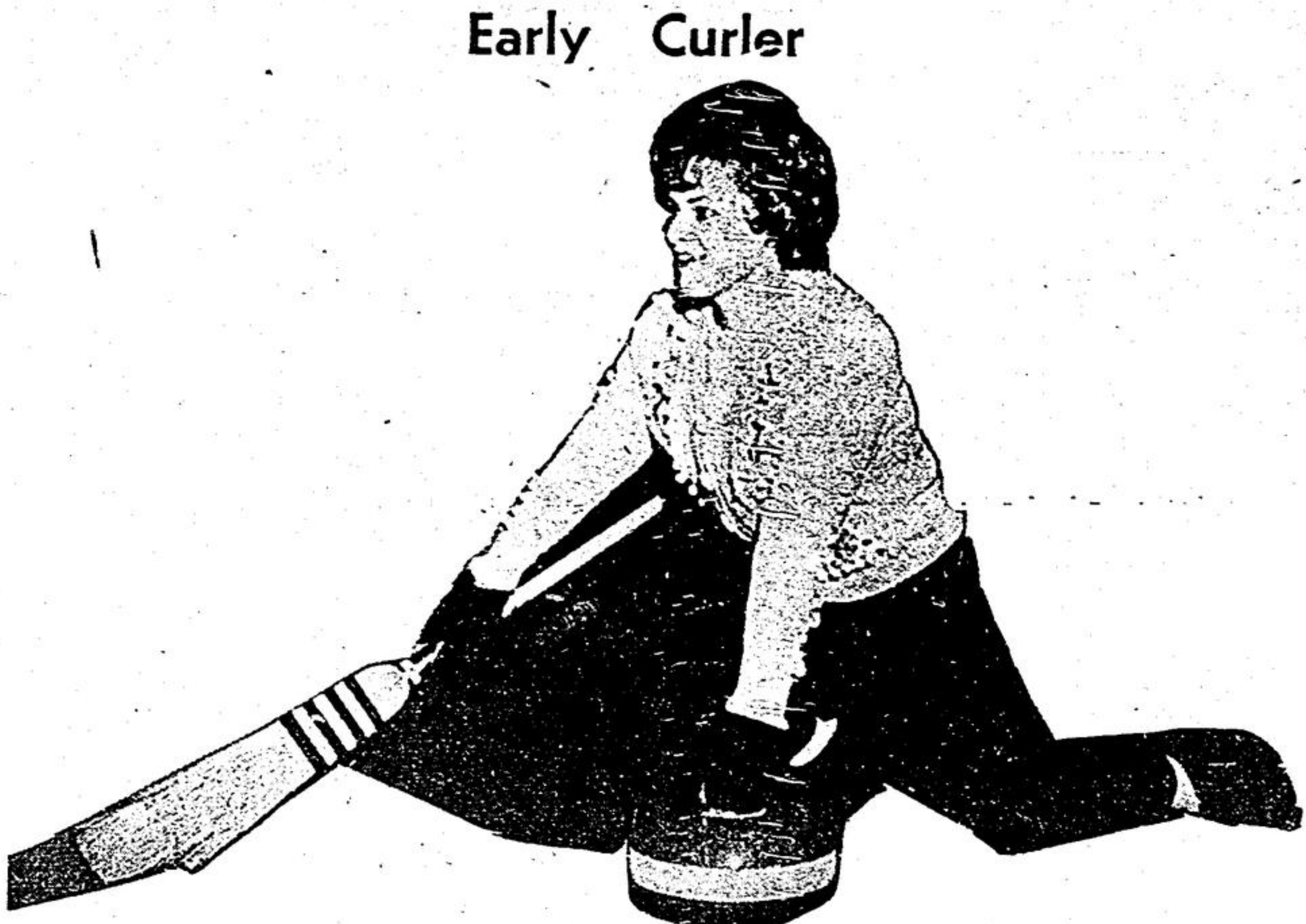
The Difference

Ron Stewart Shoots 3 Goals in Final Frame; Uxbridge Wins 5-4

With a single-handed 3-goal scoring spree in the third period, Goodwood's Ron Stewart "stole" a two-point victory from the Stouffville "Clippers" and sparked Uxbridge to a thrilling 5-4 win in a Junior "C" contest on Tuesday night. The season's largest crowd of over 300 patrons watched the homesteamers grab the lead on three separate occasions only to have Uxbridge stage a come-back rally.

The helmeted front-line puck-juggler tied the score at 3-3 early in the final frame, then struck for two more after Stouffville's Ken Beckett had given the "Clippers" a 4-3 edge. Keith Stewart, the other half of the brother combination, assisted on two of the timely tallies. Mike Gray and Gary Jackson were the other Uxbridge marksmen.

John Roxborough was once again the driving force up front for Stouffville. He capitated around the ice with amazing agility and collected one goal and two assists. Ken Beckett, Wayne Pennanen and Stan Feasby were the other "Clipper" goal-getters. For rearguard, Feasby, it was his first tally of the season, although he has collected 7 assists.

The contest was a real goal-tenders' battle. Glen Jackson in the Stouffville net and Rick Markus in the Uxbridge cage completed some great stops. Jackson's finest effort came on a clean-cut breakaway by Ron Stewart early in the second period. He held the fort and the drive carried off his pads. Stouffville outshot Uxbridge 31 to 18.

Garry Jackson, like rival Roxborough, was a scoring threat for Uxbridge every time out. Although he picked up only one goal, he assisted on one other and as "robbed" on numerous other occasions. First-class officiating kept the game under strict control. Penalties were numerous but it did not detract

WOULD PIPE UNIONVILLE SEWAGE TWO MILES TO MARKHAM PLANT

The Ontario Water Resources has advised that no new sewage disposal plant should be built to accommodate the Falldon subdivision just north of No. 7 highway at Unionville, but that the sewage should be piped to the Markham Village plant. This is a distance of approximately two miles.

Mr. Grant, who appeared at Markham Township Council meeting on Monday wished to know who was going to pay for such an expenditure. It was stated that the township should assist in the financing of such a line. Mr. Grant further drew attention to predictions of the township planning director, that Unionville population would increase to 7,000.

Councillor Chas. Hoover said it was his opinion that the proposed sub-division was premature. There had been no indication that the present population in Unionville was desirous of sharing in the program.

Mr. Grant said that the developers had secured a location from which water could be obtained at the rate of 300,000 gallons a day but requested that the council take the action to obtain the site and it would remain township property.

After some discussion, council suggested that Mr. Grant meet with the Unionville Trustees to ascertain their thinking on the project and that council would then discuss the matter at a future meeting.
