A joint meeting of Markham Township council and Planning Board is to be held this Thursday night. The special joint meeting is to consider the request for permission to allow development of 1400 new homes in the southwest corner of the township.

5 Companies Bidding for Town Pensions

Five insurance companies appeared before Stouffville municipal council Thursday evening to present plans for the establishment of a group pension plan for the town employees. Some eleven people would be eligible for the plan, including the employees of the Public Utilities Commission.

Basic provision of the plans is for a five percent pay deduction to be matched by five percent from employers.

At the conclusion of the presentations Reeve Timbers advised that when the necessary number of copies of each plan had been received, the employees would be called to a special meeting for a discussion on the pension, to be followed by a meeting of the finance committee.

Heavy Use Of Sand

Road Supt. Davis advised Whitechurch Twp. council Monday that the municipality's entire stock of 2500 tons of sand had been used up and it was necessary to draw in sand direct from the pit at Gormley. He also stated that he had to provide an assistant at the pit, as Kenneth Baker had been injured and was unable to work.

Reeve Wallwork said that the sand shortage was becoming general in nearly every municipality. There had been considerable ice to attend to and residents were becoming more demanding in their requests for sanding service.

The Beamish Construction Co. have a steamer operating in the township in order to keep some of the culverts open.

Council gave consent to snowplowing on certain roads not on the township system, but where the municipality was receiving some tax revenue.

"It certainly is a sorry day for society when a small township commissioner can put a price on anybody's head just because he is living, earning his living wherever he can, under the absurd pretext of "property assessment" as though man were a mere chattel or someone's property to tax procurers. It therefore becomes a most urgent incumbent for the township council to ask the Commissioner to resign," he said. In his closing remarks, Mr. Roy suggested that the Reeve should also resign from his office and a judicial enquiry should be ordered. Fair Treatment

"We should have an Assessment Commissioner whose main desire is to treat everyone fairly and render his decisions impartially," advocated Professor Francis LaBrie. "Are you trying to drive the farmers out of the area?" he asked. "Something here is sadly in remiss," he concluded.

Ward 5 councillor, Hubert Wank stated that although some serious charges had been laid, he did not feel that the Assessment Commissioner should be subjected to cross-questioning
