## Madoc Joins Stouffville and Uxbridge In Round-Robin OHA Playoff Series

Must Declare Winner By April 10th

The O.H.A. has stepped in and ruled against any extension of the group final playoff series between Stouffville and Uxbridge Juniors. On Friday night at Uxbridge, the two teams battled to a 3-3 overtime tie and the game was halted by the officials. The seven contests failed to produce a winner. Madoc, who had merely been bidding their time, will now be included in a round-robin series with Stouffville and Uxbridge. The two top teams will then engage in a 2-out-of-3 game tussle for the right to advance into further Provincial competition.

The local managements had earlier agreed to renew the Uxbridge-Stouffville playoff round on a best of three basis and a game was scheduled for the Stouffville Arena on Tuesday night. The O.H.A. squashed this decision. Since the new arrangements were not finalized until Tuesday morning, a number of disappointed spectators turned up at the arena not knowing that the contest had been cancelled.
