Mrs. Doug Morden celebrated a birthday last Monday, April 16, and Doug celebrated his on April 12.

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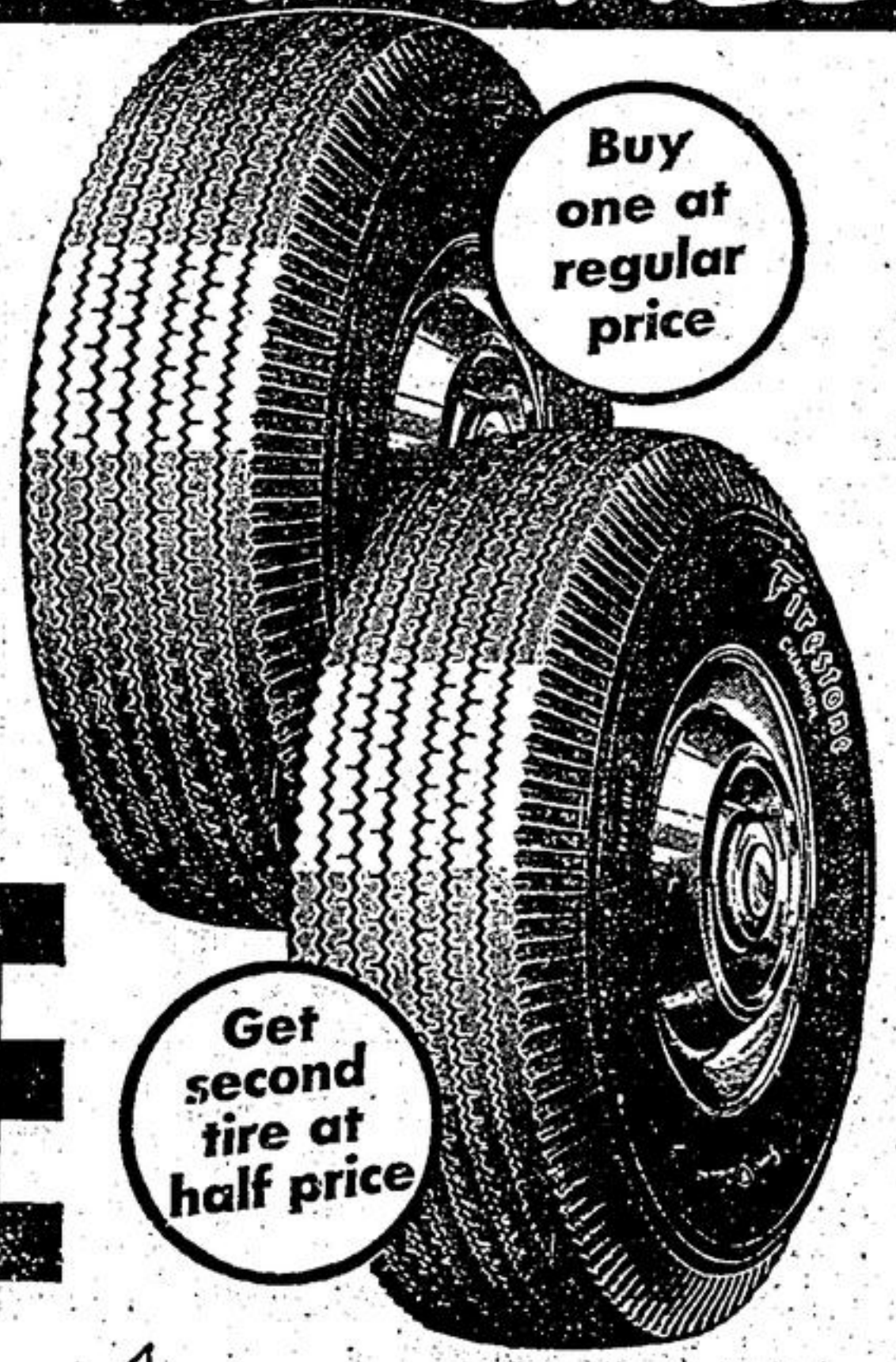
**GOODWOOD**
