**Sunday School Lesson**

**CHRIST SPEAKS TO THE CHURCHES**

(Lesson for June 10)

**GOLDEN TEXT** — Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.—Rev. 3:20.

**THE LESSON AS A WHOLE**

On the eve of His departure from this world by His ascension to Heaven, our Lord explicitly commanded His servants to evangelize and teach. This ministry would produce Christian congregations, and these churches would become, in turn, centres for corporate fellowship and instruction. Indeed, they would be "golden candlesticks," radiating the light during the "night" of Christ's absence.

The ascended Lord is head of the Church, and if spiritual health and vigor are to be enjoyed, then His voice must be both heard and heeded. Through His own servants (prophets, pastors, teachers, and exhorters) He still speaks, for He dearly loves those for whom He died.

Sometimes His words are of comfort or of encouragement; sometimes of correction or rebuke.

**The Heart of the Lesson**

It is ominously significant that Israel's last king, Zedekiah, and Christianity's last church, Laodicea, should both end in blindness (see 2 Kings 25:7 and Rev. 3:17). This physical calamity revealed their current spiritual condition.

Despite this consummation, God still spoke. Nor does Christ today lapse into silence when His own are needing to hear His voice. Of course, He does sometimes cease to speak to those who are not His own when they persistently reject Him. The case of Ephraim illustrates this when, centuries ago, He pronounced judgment in the awful word, "Ephraim is joined to idols: let him alone". (Hosea 4:17). Nor for guilty Herod, on a later day, did Jesus have any further word whatever (see Luke 23:9). When He does speak to these again, it will be in the day of His wrath.
