#### Watch Out For Children

Now that school is out once more and the streets are full of carefree children running around like playful puppies, it is best to slip on the brakes and throttle.



The law recognizes the fact that children are not responsible for their acts in the broad sense that adults are. They dash out on a road without looking, despite the fact that their anxious parents have told them dozens of times to use caution. Caution and care-free youth have a difficult time of it together. That is why school zones have extra low speed limits usually rigidly enforced.

When school is out for the summer, the school zones are spread out everywhere that children care to roam. So if you see children playing on the road, slow up well in advance and give them a wide berth when you do pass.

The Travellers Insurance Co. compiles an annual report on accident statistics of which they distribute 3,300,000 copies. That is a sizeable printing job but it's little more than enough to top the number of killed and injured Americans for the year of 1961 it covers — 3,094,600.

The most tragic of these accidents are those involving children who are killed or crippled before their life has hardly begun. To lose a little time on the chance of saving a little life are odds that any motorist would be foolish indeed to ignore.

He can be on the right end of the odds by just reducing speed, the number one cause of fatalities.

### Dept. of Highways Presents Oil Painting To Dutton Advance

A feature of the 1962 Annual Awards to Ont. Weekly Newspapers was the presentation, for the first time, of a prize to the top newspaper published in a centre of less than 1,000 population.

The prize, given by the Dept. of Highways, Ontario, was presented at the association's Annual Meeting, May 18, at London, to Herb C. Campbell, editor of the Dutton Advance, winner of First Prize for General Excellence in this group.

The award took the form of an oil painting of a local scene to be chosen by the winning editor. It will be executed by one of the Department's own artists, M. M. (Moma) Markovitch, a graduate of the Ecole Nationale des Arts, Paris.

From 1935 to 1940 Moma Markovitch designed the postage stamps issued by the Yugoslavian Government, winning in 1938 the Grand Prix for Graphic Arts awarded by the Academy of Seven Arts, Belgrade. Other art work executed for the Government of Yugoslavia, Moma's native country, include posters promoting tourism, exhibitions and the like.
