## Mike Starr had 7,000 Vote Lead In Ontario Riding

Labor Minister, Michael Starr gained a 7,000 vote majority over his nearest rival, Liberal, Norman Cafik in the Ontario Riding on Monday to retain his Federal post for a fifth consecutive term.  
Miss Aileen Hall, the N.D.P. candidate, ran a close third. A. A. Alton, carrying the Social Credit ticket, trailed the field. Closest tabulation put Starr's total at 23,002; Cafik—15,923; Hall—14,365 and Alton—474. A break-down by municipalities in the Ontario Riding shows the following results.
