

action is that it was taken against a nationally - known brand name product put out by a large and established corporation. In an indirect sense it is an indictment against questionable business practices in general that too often become our accepted method of doing things.

Advertising, for instance, that labels a car "one owner" when that owner was a taxicab company: or "low mileage" when the mileage is only low because it has been set back; "no money down" when the down payment is actually the customer's present car or a second loan is basically dishonest. It may legally skirt the area of indictable fraud but the intention is the same.

Misleading advertising has a way of coming back to haunt Its perpetrators. A sale thus gained can mean lost confidence tomorrow and lost sales with it. Similarly, honest dealings gain confidence and build sales. This Is the public's way of getting even and they always end up with last say.


