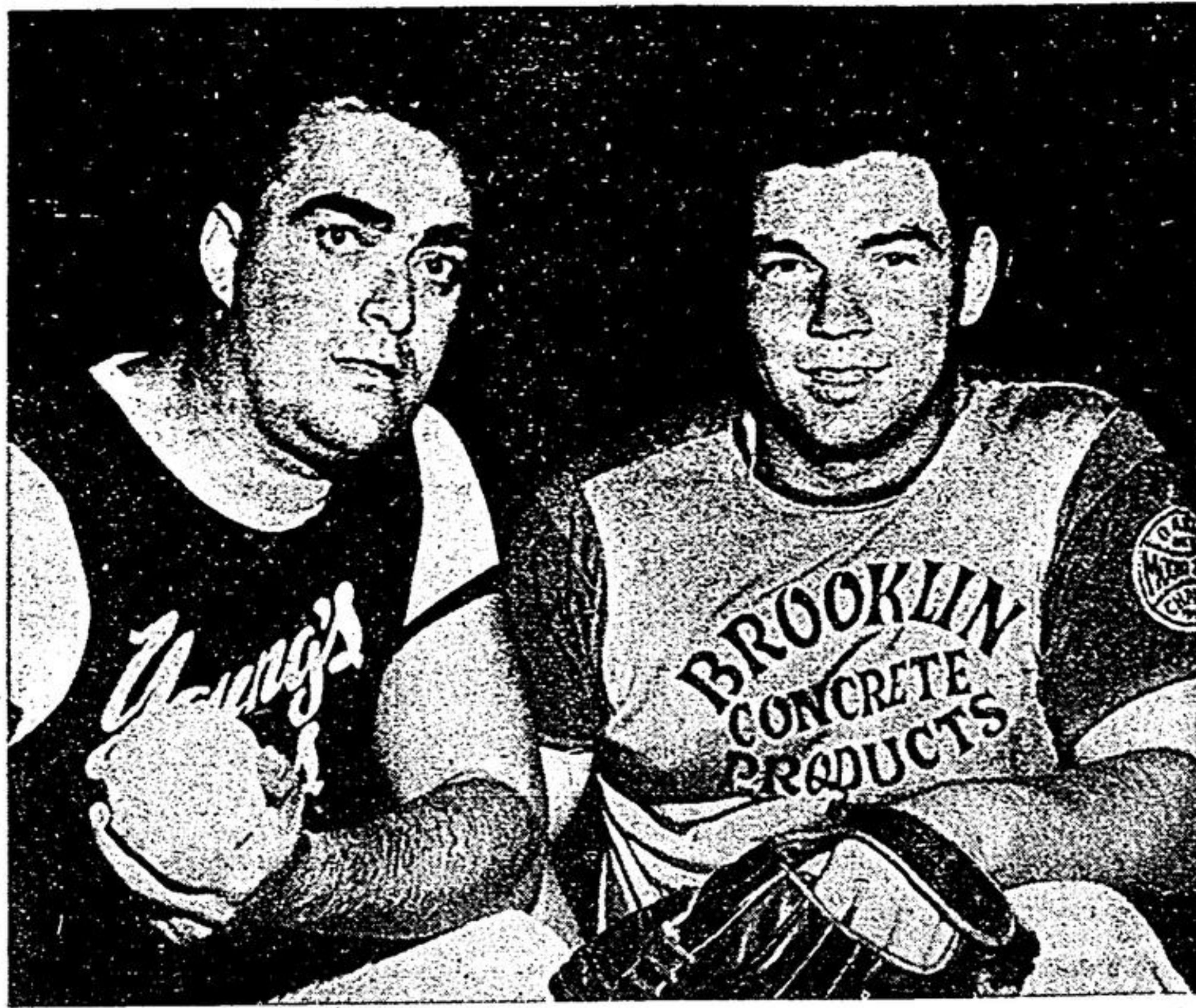


Playoff Rivals
