Stouffville Man Has Read Bible Over One Hundred Times

Champion Bible reader in the
United Missionary Church, and
probably the champion for any
denomination in all Canada, is
Mr Leslie Grove of Stouffville,
Ontario, who has just completed
reading his Bible through for the
103rd time.

Now 76 years of age, Mr. Gro-
ve finished the 100th read-
ing of the Scriptures one week
before his birthday on the last
day of June. On this occasion
he read out loud, reading the
entire Bible on his knees. The
total time required was 70
hours.

Since then he has read the
Bible another three times, which
means he now has completed
reading it through no less than
103 times, a record which rarely
has been equalled in all his-
tory.

A Christian for 66 years,
Brother Grove was converted
as a boy of ten at a camp meet-
ing held by the United Missio-
nary Church at Dickson's Hill
near Markham, Ontario. At the
close of the camp he was bap-
tized, and two or three weeks
later joined the Dickson's Hill
Church.

Even in those early years he
had a great love for God's
Word. On one occasion, a few
weeks after his conversion, one
Sunday he recited a total of 150
verses from memory at Sun-
day School.

Early in his teens he started
working for the Lord. At four-
teen he was elected secretary of
the Dickson's Hill Sunday
School. At seventeen he became
teacher of the young men's
class, and the following year
was chosen to teach the old
men's Bible class. This forced
him to study the Bible and he
became better acquainted than
ever with its contents.

For seven years Leslie Grove
lived in the Canadian West.
Here it was, at Markham, Al-
berta, under a sermon preached
by Rev. Alvin Traub, that he
was sanctified and yielded his
life entirely to the Lord. At
that time he was a young man
of 25.

During his active life Brother
Grove served in several capa-
cities. He labored as a farmer,
a baker, and a factory worker,
and for eight years served as a
United Missionary pastor in the
Ontario District — three years
at Elmwood and Hanover and

five years on the Bruce penin-
sula.
For several years following
his marriage he read the Bible
through on an average of once
a year. As a pastor he increased
this to five or six times a year,
feeling that a thorough know-
ledge of God's Word was a won-
derful asset to any minister.

Since retiring from fulltime
work almost three years ago,
Mr Grove has devoted more
time than ever to reading of his
beloved Bible. It is his chief
source of interest and the center
of his life.

About the same time as he re-
tired the United Missionary
Church announced that 1960
would be observed throughout
the denomination as a Year
of Evangelism. Among other
things great emphasis was placed
upon the Holy Scriptures, and
all members were urged to read
the Bible through at least
once during the year.

With more time on his hands,
Mr Grove took the request seri-
ously, and that year read the
Bible through no less than fif-
teen times.

At the end of the year he
reported: "Every time I read
the Bible, the more I love it, and
the deeper the truths I see in it.
All elderly people could very
profitably spend a large part of
their time in reading God's
Word."

Last year he devoted more
time than ever to reading the
Bible and actually read it
through twenty times during the
twelve-month period. This
year, by the help of the Lord,
he hopes to exceed that number.
Leslie Grove finds that he
can read the entire Bible in from
60 to 70 hours. On four occa-
sions, reading from twelve to
fifteen hours a day, he has com-
pletely read the Bible through
in only five days.

"It's an experience which
every Christian should have
sometime in his life," he says.
"You get something out of read-
ing like that, which you miss
when you take a whole year
or longer to read the Bible
through."

Every morning Mr Grove
thanks the Lord for three
things: salvation, good health,
and a wonderful memory.
He says age has not dimmed
his memory, and he can mem-
orize Scripture today as well as
he ever could. He especially
likes to recite some of the
psalms such as psalm 1, 2, 8, 23,
24, 51, 90 and 91 in the New
Testament he enjoys Romans
12, parts of the Sermon on the
Mount, and many of the para-
bles.

One day, some time ago, when
riding in a car for two hours,
he recited Scripture to the
driver during the entire trip.
Somewhat of a poet, Mr Grove

whatsoever ye shall ask of the
Father in My name, He may
give it you."

Bro. Grove believes Psalm

92:14 is God's plan for his life:
"They shall still bring forth
fruit in old age."

Recently (1958-1961) he served
a term of three years as class
leader of the Gormley U.M.
Church.

Last year when he was invited
to preach in a church of an-
other denomination on Sunday
morning, the Holy Spirit took
over the service and the meeting
did not end until two o'clock.
Several adults were saved and
sanctified, including one Roman
Catholic. The latter is now acti-
vely serving the Lord and is
teaching a Sunday School class.

Right now, although 76, Mr
Grove is in West Virginia where
he is engaged in a three-week
effort. He says he is ready to
serve God as a Bible teacher,
evangelist, or in whatever capa-
city his Lord may choose.

And if you should ever drop in
on him unexpectedly, some day,
what do you suppose you would
find him doing? Why, reading
his Bible, of course!

ship of Markham proposes at its meeting to be held at the
Markham Township Council Chambers atuttonville,
Ontario, on the 22nd day of October, 1962, at the hour of
two o'clock in the afternoon to pass a by-law to authorize
the stopping up and sale of the following described portion
of highway.

That parcel of land situate in the Township of Mark-
ham and being part of the road allowance between lots
10 and 11, Concession 4, said road allowance being that
portion reverted to the Municipality by Deposited Plan
Number 2649 (Highway File — A-4231) Registered May
16th, 1930, more particularly described as follows:-

From a bar planted at the north-west angle of
Registered Plan Number 3560 a distance of 10.08' on
a bearing of S. 72 deg. 31 min. 10 sec. W. thence N.
10 deg. 11 min. 50 sec. W. a distance of 10.08' to a point
in the east limit of Don Mills (unwidened), said point
being the point of Commencement

Assuming the bearing of Don Mills Road to be
N. 10 deg. 11 min. 50 sec. W. thence northerly in and
along the east limit of Don Mills Road 66.54 feet.

Thence N. 72 deg. 31 min. 10 sec. E. in and along
the north limit of the road allowance between Lots
10 and 11 a distance of 70.97'

Thence 68.72' on a line bearing S. 1 deg. 19 min. E.
said line being the production of the line from a bar
at the south west angle of the property described in
Instrument Number 33640 and through a bar planted
in the north limit of said property and 41.51' from the
