

Win Timbers Returned As Reeve; Ken Betz New Council Member

Reeve Win Timbers of Stouffville was returned to office for a second term on Monday as former reeve Ken Wagg failed in his bid to return to office.

Councillor Bud Spang again topped the polls for council as he did in his initial run last year. He polled 877 votes which was 260 ahead of his nearest opponent and council's newest member Ken Betz.

Slightly more than a thousand voters turned out which was approximately sixty per cent of the electorate. The amount of campaigning was about normal with all candidates, but the voters appeared reasonably satisfied with the present administration and voted accordingly.

For the most part, throughout the township, the same support that rallied behind Reeve Dean was also on the bandwagon for Mr. Hooper.

It was a weird turn of events that saw Mr. Dean defeat Mr. Mumberson in his home polls of Buttonville and Victoria Sq.

At councillor Hooper's home poll in Buttonville, the veteran campaigner held a huge lead of 183 to 60 Mr. Mumberson, and Mr. Dullege both polled heavily in Highland Park and Henderson Ave.

Despite the pre-election battle that raged on the public platform, the turnout at the polls was poor considering the thousands of eligible voters in the township.
