Mrs. Dariball, teacher of Floral Art at the Markham High School, will give a demonstration on Christmas Decorations.

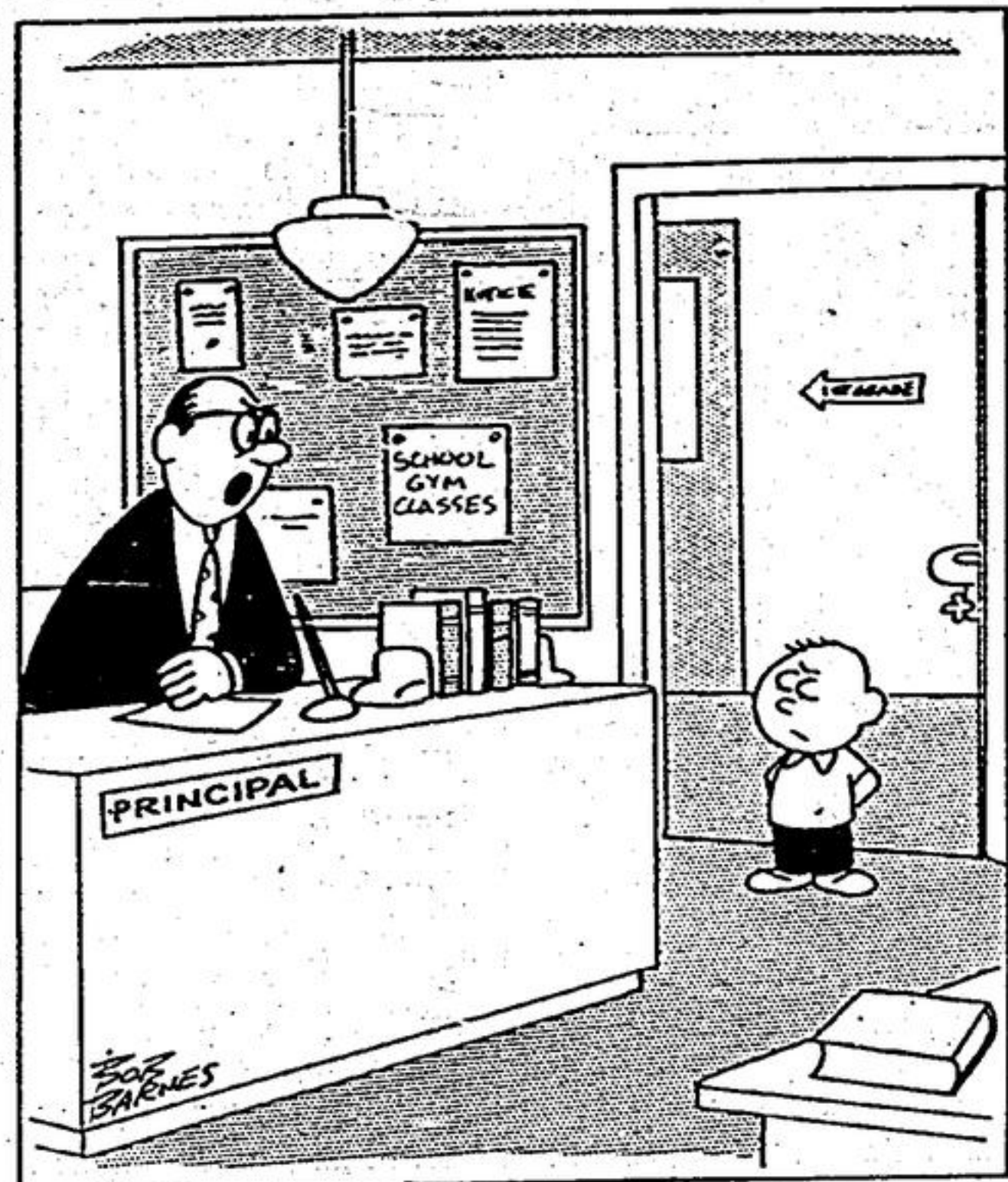
Hostesses will be Mrs. G. Morrison, Mrs. E. Empringham, Miss Mary Muirhead.

Would Ban Cottagers As Council Candidates

A brief which could be of interest to ratepayers at Muselman's Lake and Wilcox Lake in Whitechurch Township, has been presented to the Ontario legislature's committee on municipal law. The brief is from a Muskoka Ratepayers' Association, and urges amendment to the Municipal Act to prevent summer cottage owners running as candidates for election to the local council.

A Supreme Court ruling last summer gave two cottage owners in the United Townships of Medora and Wood the right to election to council, although they resided in Toronto for most of the year.

The ratepayers' brief said the ruling by Mr. Justice S. N. Schatz was contrary to the concept of a municipality and raised the ancient fear of absentee landlordism. The functions of municipal government
