"Any dog feels hunger just as much as a human," he said.

UXBRIDGE TWP. TO HIRE NEW ASSESSOR

The Twp. of Uxbridge will acquire the services of a new assessor to replace Mr. Fred Clubine, sidelined last year due to ill health. Applications will close at 5 p.m. on Jan. 29th. The matter was discussed at the inaugural meeting of council on Monday.

During the latter part of 1962, the council had to seek

assistance from the County Assessment Department when their own employee was hospitalized. Some members considered it unwise to consider this arrangement again in 1963 due to the number of appeals in '62.

Relief Is Low
Relief payments continue at an exceptionally low ebb in Uxbridge. With total payments in December amounting to less than \$400. Welfare officer, Len Pilkey presented his report. At the present time, only eight families are acquiring relief assistance.
