

DUMP WHITCHURCH

Whitchurch Township will have a new garbage disposal area beginning April 1st. The new dump will be on lot 14. conc. & The new agreement is between Leidra Farms Ltd. and Oliver Pellett who operated a former township dump until ratepayer objection forced abandonment.

Permission is given for dumping on condition of daily covering of the refuse and the construction of a road to serve the trucks. Private individuals may also use the property providing they are residents of the township. The previous dump on Highway 48 was used by many persons outside the area. The agreement for the use covers five years.

WORK THIS WEEK

A special meeting of Whitchurch Township Council has been requested for this Thursday night by the Road Superintendent, to ascertain the amount of work to be undertaken this year in each part of the township. The amount of money approved by the Dept. of Highways for construction is \$30,000, and for maintenance \$115,000. However, it is expected that the township's requirements will come nearer \$200,000 which would require a supplementary bylaw for \$55,000.


