J. M. McIntyre Marks 88th Birthday

Mr. James Miller McIntyre celebrated his 88th birthday on Feb. 24. He was born in Lesna-dill, Arnagh County, Ireland, in 1875. Coming to Canada in 1902, he worked for the T. Eaton Co. in Toronto for 5 years after which he returned to Ireland to try his hand at farming. In 1918 he married Sarah Jane Ferris and returned five years later to Toronto where he work-ed at the Union Station for a year. Coming to Bethesda, he bought the James Drewery farm which he farmed for 23 years. In 1947 he bought the Fred Feigel Garage at Victoria Square where he spent the next five years, before returning to Bethesda, where he retired in the A. B. Shaffer home in 1952. They have a family of two children, a daughter, Mrs. Geo. Williamson and a son John in Phoenix, Arizona.
