Hon. Mike Starr To Visit Claremont-Uxbridge Next Week

A traditional Mike Starr reception has again been planned for the Town of Uxbridge and surrounding districts. Saturday, March 23, is the day set aside so that Hon. Michael Starr can renew acquaintances with friends in the northern sections of the historic Ontario Riding.

Mike Starr, along with his wife, Anne, will be present at a coffee party for women in the afternoon and will greet his hundreds of women supporters personally. Then in the evening the hard working men of the area will be welcomed at a social, an event which has gained much popularity over the past years. Hon. Matthew Dymond, Ontario's Minister of Health, who lives in Port Perry, will also be present at both functions.

Mike Starr will take the opportunity during the two party intervals to greet his friends on the streets of Uxbridge and rap on hundreds of doors in the area renewing long-standing friendships.

The Uxbridge visit is just part of an exhaustive swing Mike Starr is making through the riding that starts early in the day and brings him home late at night.

Mike Starr has an unmatched knowledge of Ontario Riding. He is a familiar figure at every "four corners", on every city street and concession road in the riding.

A 24-hour day does not leave him too many sleeping hours. He has represented Ontario Riding in the House of Commons at Ottawa, since 1952. As Canada's Labour Minister, Mike Starr must, of course, make frequent trips to Canada's capital city to help conduct the affairs of the nation with other cabinet ministers headed by Prime Minister John Diefenbaker.

Last Saturday he attended a cabinet meeting at Ottawa after only three hours sleep and arrived back in the riding to attend the Oshawa and District softball Banquet in Oshawa in the evening.

The highlight of Mike Starr's activities last week was at Port Hope where he introduced Prime Minister Diefenbaker to 2,000 persons attending an afternoon rally. Practically everyone recognized the popular Cabinet Minister, as he walked on the stage at the Port Hope High School.

The Community Hall at Claremont will be meeting place for Mike Starr, March 19, commencing at 8 p.m. A strong voice in the House of Commons, Mike Starr will outline the policy of the Progressive Conservative government in a forthright and down to earth manner, the type of speech which has won acclaim all across the province. His audience is also encouraged to ask questions for Mike to answer.
