P. C.'s WILL AID FARMERS - STARR

Hon. Michael Starr, Canada's Labor Minister since 1957, said at Uxbridge Saturday a Progressive Conservative government will continue to expand assistance to farmers.

"We will provide credit for export sales of agricultural products and will continually improve price stabilization and support legislation," he said.

Mr. Starr, who has represented Ontario Riding at Ottawa since 1952 and is seeking re-election April 8, greeted hundreds of his friends at two receptions and on the streets and in many homes in Uxbridge.

He said he has never permitted his national duties to impede his work on behalf of the people of Ontario Riding and it is a pledge he would never break.

Turning back to agricultural policies, Mr. Starr said a Progressive Conservative government will also extend further credit to farmers to create economic farm units and launch a special feed grain and storage assistance plan for Eastern Canada and promote better land use and water conservation.

"We will use the surplus of our farm products in support of the World Food Bank, the idea which was advanced by the Progressive Conservative government and which is now in existence," he said.

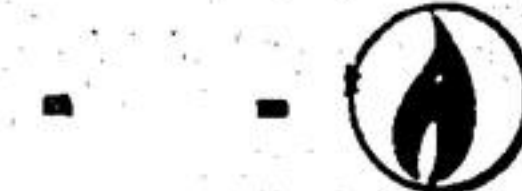

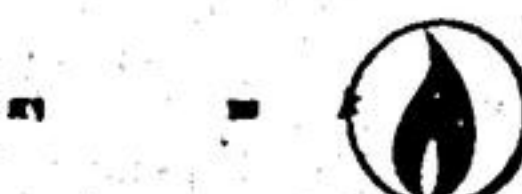

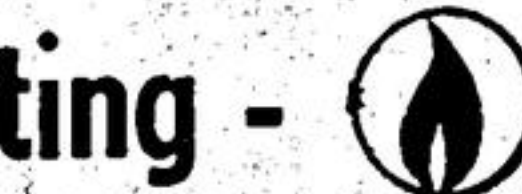
